Decision

The Board approved by correspondence the revision of the Nepal transitional interim country strategic plan to, inter alia, extend its end date by six months, from 1 July 2018 to 31 December 2018, and approved a corresponding increase in the country portfolio budget in the amount of USD 11,013,522.

Rationale

- 1. The Nepal transitional interim country strategic plan (T-ICSP) was approved by the Executive Director in June 2017 for six months from 1 January 2018. The expectation was that a full country strategic plan (CSP) starting on 1 July 2018 would be submitted for approval by the Executive Board at its 2018 annual session.
- 2. The original timeline for undertaking the zero-hunger strategic review and developing the CSP was short, and indeed the two processes overlapped to a limited extent. The overlap increased, however, as a result of delays in the strategic review caused by two Nepali holidays and elections in the third and fourth quarters of 2017.
- 3. It is important that the strategic review inform the CSP. It is also important that the review not be rushed, as that could affect the independence of the review, WFP's reputation with the Government and the research process. The country office and regional bureau accordingly agreed to postpone the submission of the CSP to the Board's 2018 second regular session EB and to seek a revision of the T-ICSP to extend its duration to cover the period leading up to the beginning of the CSP on 1 January 2019. The required adjustment will be implemented through a budget revision.
- 4. The revision will effect a six-month extension of the duration of the T-ICSP, moving the current 30 June 2018 end date to 31 December 2018. This extension covers an increase in the budget to activity 1 School-aged children in food-insecure and remote rural areas have sustainable access to food by 2022, and activity 8 Ensure business continuity to enable WFP to respond to a catastrophic disaster by establishing safe facilities.¹
- 5. The current revision also reflects an increase in the number of students to be assisted under activity 1 from January to July 2018 from 200,000 to 236,000.

Changes

Strategic orientation

- 6. No strategic changes are introduced in this revision.
 - Strategic outcomes
- 7. No changes are made to the strategic outcomes or to activities 1 and 8 of the original T-ICSP.

Beneficiary analysis

- 8. The number of students assisted under activity 1 from January to July 2018 will increase from the original 200,000 to 236,000.
- 9. As part of the planned transition to the Government-led school meals programme, WFP reduced the number of students covered by its school meals programme from 330,000 in 2015 to 250,000 in 2017 and plans to reduce the figure to 200,000 in 2018. To ensure a

smooth transition the Ministry of Education has requested WFP to continue coverage for 236,000 students until July 2018, the end of the Government's fiscal year, to give the ministry time to plan for government resources to cover the schools graduating from the WFP programme.

- 10. The Government is committed to the national school meals programme, one of the largest safety nets for schoolchildren in Nepal; further scaling up is under discussion. The Ministry of Education has pledged an annual budget of USD 8.2 million. Alignment of WFP's transition plan with the Government's plan would facilitate a smooth transition and position WFP for further partnership opportunities.
- 11. There are no changes in the number of beneficiaries under any other T-ICSP activities.

Transfers

- 12. There are no changes in transfers to beneficiaries under activity 1; pupils will receive the same per-person per-day ration of 80 g of rice, 20 g of pulses, 10 g of vegetable oil and 1g of salt.
- 13. There are no changes in the transfers under the other T-ICSP activities.
- 14. The budget revision includes an increase in capacity strengthening to accommodate the budget available from the in-kind contribution received and carry-over funds from 2017.

Supply chain

15. There are no changes in the T-ICSP supply chain plan.

Other considerations

- 16. There are no changes in the capacities of the country office or partnerships in this six-month extension.
- 17. The changes in the monitoring and evaluation arrangements are linked to the additional six months' duration of the activity and the consequent extension of these activities over the longer period.
- 18. There are no additional risks.

Cost

19. The budget increase and extension of the duration of the T-ICSP are required to accommodate a one-year contribution received and expected carry-over commodities from 2017 and to allow the programming of funds required to implement activity 8. The budget changes reflect the budget confirmed for this contribution and the approval in the original budget of the construction project to establish safe facilities that will ensure WFP business continuity in case of a catastrophic disaster.
