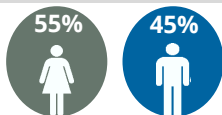

Highlights

- WFP has reached 4,000 people with CSB++ in Leer and Mayendit County in Central Unity. WFP continues to liaise with local authorities to re-establish regular distribution centers in Leer, Mayendit and Koch counties.
- WFP has prepositioned over 119,500 mt of food commodities, surpassing its record from the same time last year. WFP will continue to work towards reaching the target of 140,000 mt, 20 percent higher than planning figures from 2017.

Situation Update

- The food security situation remains dire. An updated Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) report which will reveal the extent of the food security situation and affected locations during this peak hunger season is being finalised. The IPC offers a set of standardized measures to determine the severity and magnitude of food insecurity in a country.
- The situation in Central Unity remains tense. WFP continues to collaborate with the other humanitarian actors to request for 21 days of tranquility from 25 June to 15 July in Leer, Mayendit and Koch to enable children and other civilians to have access to an emergency Cholera vaccination campaign and other life-saving assistance.

WFP Response

- WFP and Cooperating Partners reached 2.65 million people with a total of 24,360 mt of food during the May distribution cycle, equivalent to 66 percent of planned beneficiaries reached and 77 percent of planned commodities distributed.
- WFP has conducted simultaneous registrations in Nyiroil county reducing the risk of duplication to ensure accuracy, resulting in a 30 percent reduction in beneficiary caseload. WFP has also reached an agreement with the communities to gradually introduce resilience building activities to replace general food distribution.
- WFP has registered an additional 9,000 beneficiaries in the Juba Urban Programme over the last two weeks. In total, over 19,000 people are now registered in the programme. The Juba Urban Programme provides cash assistance to vulnerable urban households, provided that they attend trainings such as business skills, hygiene and nutrition over the course of six months.

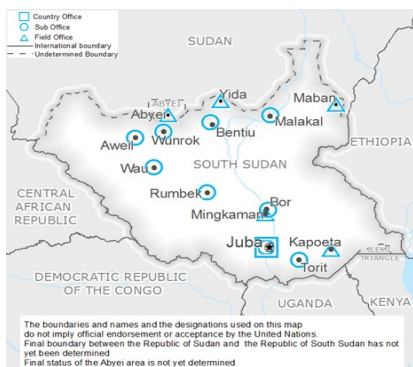

Food and Nutrition Assistance

- WFP has delivered 2,645 mt of food commodities through the Integrated Rapid Response Mechanism (IRRM), assisting 163,000 people in 8 counties (Canal/Pigi, Ayod, Mayom, Ulang, Nassir, Fangak, Leer and Mayendit) over the past two weeks.
- WFP is conducting state-level School Meals Stakeholders workshops in all of its field office locations, with an aim to enhance programme quality, raise awareness of the programme and increase buy-in at the local level. Trainings have so far been completed in Abyei, Aweil, Bor, Juba and Rumbek with participation from WFP and cooperating partner field staff and officials from the state ministries of education and health.



Gender and Protection

- WFP and United Nation Population Fund (UNFPA) signed a two year framework of cooperation (2018-2020). The agencies have committed to collaborate closely across sectors and activities to uphold women and girls' dignity, by mainstreaming protection against Gender-Based Violence across all food/cash assistance and livelihood programmes.



Supply Chain

- Notwithstanding challenges posed by the onset of the rainy season which has resulted in a reduction in road deliveries across the country, WFP continues to work towards achieving its 2018 prepositioning target of 140,000 mt.
- During the reporting weeks, a total of 1,734 mt of assorted commodities were delivered by air, bringing to 2,260 mt the total air delivery in June. WFP has delivered 31,0039 mt by air since the beginning of the year.
- The emergency repairs of 10 choke points* over lots 1-4 of the Juba—Rumbek road have been completed. All contractors have been handed over the sites for maintenance and are tasked to undertake preventive maintenance to keep the road open and rescue commercial trucks, if needed.

Clusters and Common Services



Food Security & Livelihoods Cluster

- The FSL cluster along with three other clusters have prepared key messages on integration to be delivered to beneficiaries and communities. The main objective is to promote a joint response mechanism through collaboration, colocation and coordination in case of famine and strengthen early warning systems.



Logistics Cluster

- The Logistics Cluster held two trainings on the

fundamentals of humanitarian logistics, hosted by Relief International and Save the Children. Some 49 humanitarian workers from 23 organizations completed the training. Over the two days, participants gained hands on experience in procurement, transport and warehouse management. With these trainings and only half way through the year, the Logistics Cluster surpassed its target of training 300 national staff in humanitarian logistics in 2018.

- The Logistics Cluster has temporarily relocated its dedicated Mi-8 helicopter from Bor to Wau to support the Dolo response. From 14 to 21 June, 13 mt of critical relief items have been transported on behalf of three organizations.
- The Logistics Cluster supports WFP's efforts to keep the Juba-Rumbek road open throughout the rainy season by setting up an information system on choke points* along the road. Over the past weeks, the cluster has compiled and shared a daily access constraints report based on information from convoy leaders, contractors, and WFP engineers and provided GIS support to visualize the worst sections on a map. These information are passed on to contractors and engineers and supports them in doing maintenance on the road to keep the traffic flowing.
- The Logistics Cluster facilitated the transport of 183 mt of Food Security, Education, General Operations, General Program, Logistics, Health, Nutrition, Protection, Shelter and WASH cargo to 19 locations on behalf of 17 organizations.

UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- UNHAS transported 4,152 passengers and 65.8 mt light humanitarian cargo to 70 locations across South Sudan.
- UNHAS performed three medical evacuations from Nyal and Malakal to Juba on behalf of three organizations.
- In support of the Inter-Cluster Working Group (ICWG) Rapid Response Mission (ICRM) mechanism, UNHAS transported 20 passengers to/from Dolo, Karmoun, Nyanapol, Padek, and Wai.
- WFP Aviation performed 60 airdrop flights, dropping 1,694 mt of food commodities.

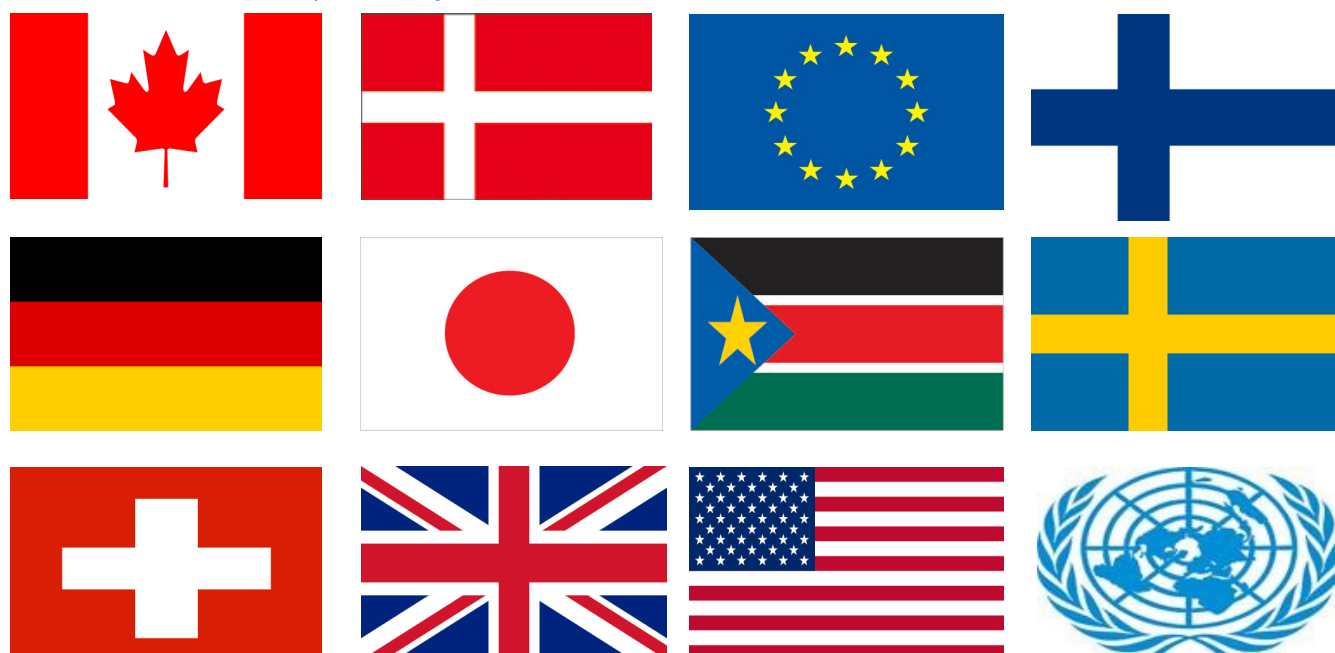
* A choke point is a point in the road which is particularly vulnerable to becoming impassable during the rainy season.
