Highlights

- WFP has reached over 826,000 flood affected individuals with vital food and nutrition assistance.
- WFP is leading a collaboration on Gender-Based Violence across the food and livelihoods sector.
- WFP is planning to erect 150 Mobile Storage Units (MSU) in 2020 to expand storage capacity in the country.
- Signatories and non-signatories of the revitalized peace agreement sign a peace declaration with support from the regional body IGAD.

Situation Update

- Under the auspices of the Community of Sant'Egidio in Rome, and with support from the regional body, the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD), the government of South Sudan, the South Sudan Opposition Movements Alliance, the Sudan People's Liberation Movement/Army-in opposition, and the National Democratic Movement have signed a peace declaration. The parties recommitted to the Secession of Hostilities Agreement of December 2017 to avoid confrontation between the signatories and non-signatories of the revitalized peace agreement. The parties called for continued and uninterrupted humanitarian access to local and international organizations.
- Incidents of localized and intercommunal conflict continue to be reported across South Sudan and hinder access to vulnerable communities. WFP operations have recently been disrupted in Maiwut and parts of Maban, former Upper Nile state, and parts of Yei county, former Central Equatoria state.
- Prices for the main staple foods remained consistent over the last two weeks in most reference markets. The observed stability is associated with the opening of roads that were inaccessible during the rainy months, and hence improved supply of food commodities to the markets.
- WFP, in collaboration with the National Bureau of Statistics, FAO, UNICEF and other partners, continues to collect data for the Food Security and Nutrition Monitoring System (FSNMS) a nationwide, rural, randomly sampled household survey. Data collection has been completed in all locations, with the exception of Duk, former Jonglei state. FSNMS data will provide indicative food security findings and nutritional status findings in order to inform the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) report.

WFP Response

Food and Nutrition Assistance

• WFP and cooperating partners have provided food and nutrition support to some 29,500 people, including 7,213 children under 5, with around 486 mt of assorted food items distributed in Nyirol and Longochuk counties as part of the Rapid Response Mechanism in the last two weeks.

Flood Response

- Since October 2019, WFP has reached over 826,000 flood affected individuals with vital food and nutrition assistance. So far, more than 16,600 mt of assorted food commodities have been distributed to people affected by floods.
- In Aweil, former Northern Bahr el Ghazal state, a total of 494 mt of assorted food commodities were distributed to 72,310 floodaffected people in Aweil North, Aweil West, and Aweil East counties.

Gender and Protection

 WFP is leading a collaboration between World Vision South Sudan, the Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Sub-Cluster, the Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL) Cluster and WFP on GBV across the food and livelihoods sector. The collaboration includes the development of a FSL GBV safety audit tool, FSL capacity development on GBV awareness, mitigation, prevention and referrals, data analysis for localized and broader trends in GBV experiences of persons accessing FSL assistance, and necessary actions for ongoing GBV intervention in the sector. The collaboration was informally launched on January 15.



- WFP is planning to erect 150 Mobile Storage Units (MSU) in 2020 to expand storage capacity in the country. The prepositioning target has increased from 175,000 mt in 2019 to 190,000 mt this year and additional storage is needed to meet the target.
- WFP river operations continue successfully with the barge operation from Sudan, that was opened in October 2019, completing transportation of 9,520 mt of food commodities to date. Currently 3,500 mt of food commodities are in transit from Sudan to Bor. Since the Sudan - South Sudan Barge operation began, South Sudan has received a total of 48,078 mt of food from Sudan by river and road.
- WFP currently has 11 All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV) in Maban, Pibor, Bor and Old Fangak for deliveries in the last mile providing support in delivering to the hardest to reach areas.

Clusters and Common Services

Logistics Cluster

- The Logistics Cluster facilitated the transport of 194 mt of Camp Coordination and Camp Management Cluster Education, Food Security, General Operations, General Program, Health, Logistics, Nutrition, Protection, Shelter and WASH cargo to 28 locations on behalf of 28 organizations. This includes 71 mt of cargo transported to flood-affected locations such as Gumruk, Pibor and Ulang.
- The Advanced Humanitarian Logistics Training, conducted by logistics experts from the University of São Paulo's Center for Innovation of Logistics System, has started this week in Juba. This training will consist of four different sessions, benefiting humanitarian actors operating in South Sudan.
- The Global Logistics Cluster Coordinator, Athalie Mayo, is on a field visit to South Sudan between January 20 and 29.

🛧 UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- Over the last two weeks, UNHAS transported 3,073 passengers and 80 mt to of light humanitarian cargo to 55 destinations across South Sudan.
- UNHAS performed one medical evacuation on behalf of one organization from Maban.
- UNHAS transported 19 passengers for EVD support missions.
- UNHAS performed six passenger charter flights on behalf of WFP, FAO, UNHCR and USAID.
- In support of the UNICEF family reunification project, UNHAS flew eight children to be reunited with their families .
