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 At its Third Regular Session of 2001, the Board asked to be regularly informed about emergency operations (EMOPs) approved jointly by the Executive Director (ED) and the Director-General (DG) of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) or under the delegated authority of the Executive Director. Since the Second Regular Session of 2002 this information has been provided twice a year.

- 2. This report covers EMOPs approved between 1 January and 30 June 2014, as shown in the attached tables. Table A lists EMOPs with a food value of more than USD 3 million approved jointly by the Executive Director and the Director-General of FAO. Table B lists EMOPs with a food value of less than USD 3 million approved by the Deputy Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer (DED/COO) under the delegated authority of the Executive Director. Table C lists EMOPs approved by Regional Directors, Country Directors and/or the Director of Emergencies under authority delegated to them by the Executive Director.
- 3. During the period under review, a total of 14 EMOPs were approved: four by the Executive Director and the Director-General of FAO; three by the Deputy Executive Director/Chief Operating Officer; and seven by Regional Directors, Country Directors or the Director of Emergencies. These operations provide food assistance to 2.1 million people at a food cost of USD 106.4 million. The total cost to WFP is USD 388.6 million.

EMOPS APPROVED JOINTLY BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF FAO

- 4. **South Sudan 200659 (1 January–30 September 2014)** assisted vulnerable, displaced groups through targeted food assistance. Modalities included cooked food for people living at displacement sites, general food distributions (GFDs) at the same sites and for other displaced people in rural areas, and nutrition support for children under 5 and pregnant and lactating women. The EMOP assisted 1.3 million beneficiaries with 116,028 mt of food at a total cost of USD 324 million.
- 5. **Iraq EMOP 200677** (1 April—30 September 2014) provided time-critical, life-saving food assistance to internally displaced persons (IDPs), vulnerable households in conflict zones and vulnerable groups in areas with high concentrations of IDPs. WFP implemented GFDs in areas of conflict and insecurity, providing pre-packaged rations that met more than 80 percent of daily calorie requirements. The EMOP assisted 240,000 beneficiaries with 18,749 mt of food at a total cost of USD 23.2 million.
- 6. Cameroon EMOP 200689 (26 May 2014–26 January 2015) responds to the nutritional needs of refugees from the Central African Republic, including 77,000 new refugees who fled into the East and Adamaoua regions of Cameroon, placing additional strain on the limited resources of host populations. WFP provides food assistance through GFDs, and nutrition interventions to prevent and treat acute malnutrition among children under 5 and pregnant and lactating women. The EMOP is expected to reach 100,000 beneficiaries with 14,108 mt of food at a total cost of USD 15.5 million.
- 7. Chad EMOP 200672 (1 May-31 October 2014) responds to an influx of refugees from the Central African Republic, providing vulnerable refugee populations with food and vouchers. Vouchers are feasible and cost-effective in Chad, especially in the south, where production of staple foods generally exceeds local consumption and markets are functional



and accessible. The EMOP is expected to assist 150,000 people with 5,300 mt of food at a total cost of USD 14.8 million.

EMOPS Approved Under the Delegated Authority of the Deputy Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer

- 8. **Iraq IR-EMOP 200663 (16 January–15 April 2014)** provided emergency food assistance to IDPs in Iraq displaced by fighting in Ramadi and Falluja governorates. It distributed 651 mt of food as 10,000 food parcels, each of which covered 80 percent of the food needs of a family of five for one month. The project targeted approximately 9,000 beneficiaries with 1,172 mt of food at a total cost of USD 1.4 million.
- 9. **IR-EMOP** 200695¹ **Special Preparedness Activities in Ukraine** (20 March–20 June 2014) assisted vulnerable populations in preparation for a potential deterioration of the situation in Ukraine following the referendum in Crimea. Preparedness activities included scoping missions, inter-agency technical assessments, the deployment of staff, and training in cash and vouchers for potential cooperating partners and national actors, at a total cost of USD 285,731.
- 10. **IR-EMOP 200739¹ Support to Assessing the Impact of Floods on the Food Security of Affected Families in Paraguay (10 June–9 August 2014)** rapidly augmented WFP's capacities to respond to the needs of 40,000 people affected by severe floods in eight provinces. WFP deployed teams to conduct food security assessments and regional experts to participate in rapid needs assessment missions at a total cost of USD 333,331.

EMOPS Approved Under the Delegated Authority of Regional Directors, Country Directors and/or the Director of Emergencies

- 11. **Iraq IR-EMOP 200729 (15 June–15 August 2014)** complemented the emergency response of the Iraqi Government at the central and governorate levels, providing food for IDPs fleeing fighting in Mosul City. It was expected to assist 43,000 beneficiaries with 1,132 mt of food at a total cost of USD 1.5 million.
- 12. **Guinea IR-EMOP 200698 (9 April–8 July 2014)** provided emergency food and nutrition assistance to vulnerable populations affected by the Ebola virus epidemic in many parts of Guinea. It assisted 34,000 beneficiaries with 1,349 mt of food at a total cost of USD 1.4 million.
- 13. **Serbia and Montenegro IR-EMOP 200704 (18 May–17 August 2014)** aimed to augment the Governments' emergency response capacity in flood-affected areas and ensure timely delivery of life-saving assistance to flood-affected populations. It provided rescue equipment and 2 mt of high-energy biscuits to 7,000 beneficiaries at a total cost of USD 1.4 million.

¹ The immediate-response EMOPs (IR-EMOPs) described in paragraphs 9 and 10 are special preparedness activities approved through the Immediate Response Account (IRA) mechanism.



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14. **Cameroon IR-EMOP 200679** (1 March–30 May 2014) responded to the needs of 27,000 new refugees in the East and Adamaoua regions, who had fled the conflict in the Central African Republic. WFP implemented GFDs for targeted beneficiaries, helping to reduce the burden on existing refugee and host populations, providing 1,349 mt of food at a total cost of USD 1.4 million.

- 15. **Burundi IR-EMOP 200678** (1 March–31 May 2014) provided flood-affected populations with food and nutrition support. The flooding resulted from torrential rains in Bujumbura and surrounding areas and was reported as the worst ever in Burundi, leaving thousands of people homeless and causing massive destruction of assets. The operation reached 20,000 people with 703 mt of food assistance at a total cost of USD 1.3 million.
- 16. **Sudan IR-EMOP 200658** (**5 January–4 March 2014**) provided emergency food assistance to 50,000 beneficiaries. Conflict in South Sudan had caused a rapid influx of people into the Sudan, particularly into areas where conflict restricted humanitarian access, including South Kordofan and Blue Nile states. It provided 853 mt of food through GFDs at a total cost of USD 953,266.
- 17. **Bosnia and Herzegovina IR-EMOP 200705 (20 May–19 August 2014)** responded to the needs of people affected by the floods that covered a third of the country. The Government declared a state of emergency on 15 May after what officials reported as the heaviest rainfall in the Balkans for more than a century. The operation provided one-time rations of 500 g of high-energy biscuits to 150,000 of the most vulnerable people 75 mt of food at a total cost of USD 985,693.

TREND ANALYSIS

18. The value of the EMOPs approved by the Executive Director or under her delegated authority during the period covered by this report represents a decrease of USD 361 million compared with the USD 750.3 million approved during the same period in 2013.
