




Climatic Shocks

Trends of Rainfall Seasonal Performance, 2012/13 to 2019/20


The recent trends indicate that food insecurity will continue to increase, due to extreme weather events.




^{*}Brown areas showing higher intensity of dry conditions




Projected Food Insecurity in Southern Africa 2020/2021
