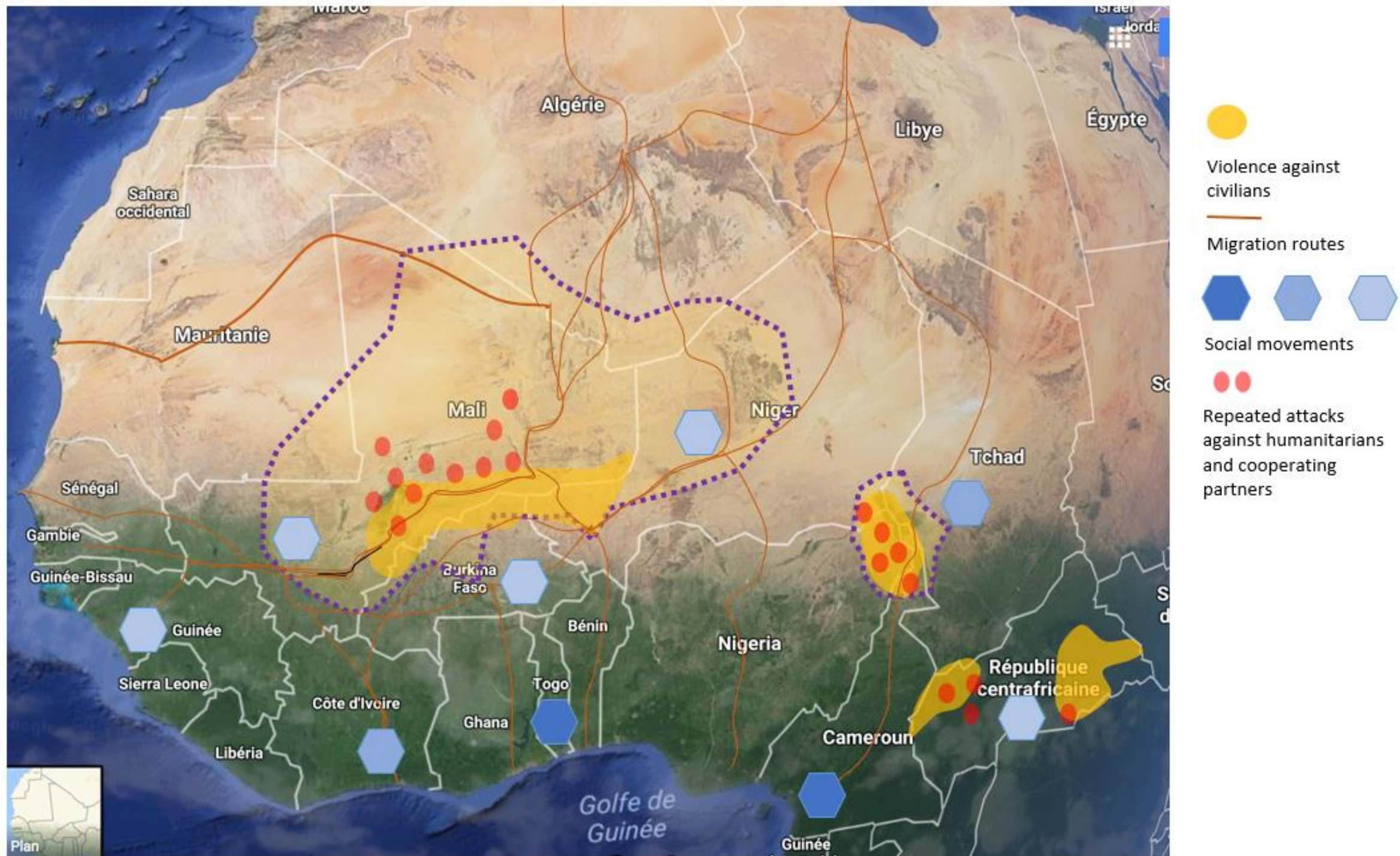

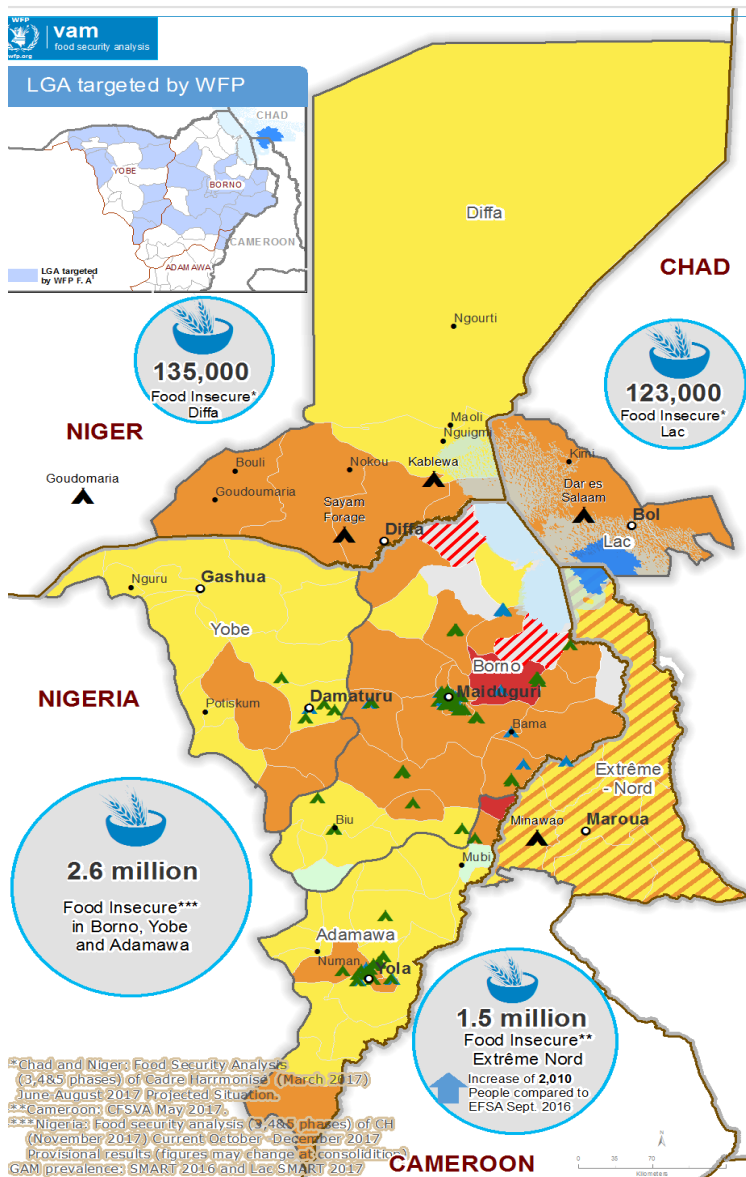

North East Nigeria

- 50 percent decrease in critically insecure people – **Averted Famine**
- Persistent insecurity and Disruption of food supplies

- Persistent and growing insecurity in Lake Chad Basin
- Rising numbers of IDPs, refugees and returnees
- Increasing protection issues.

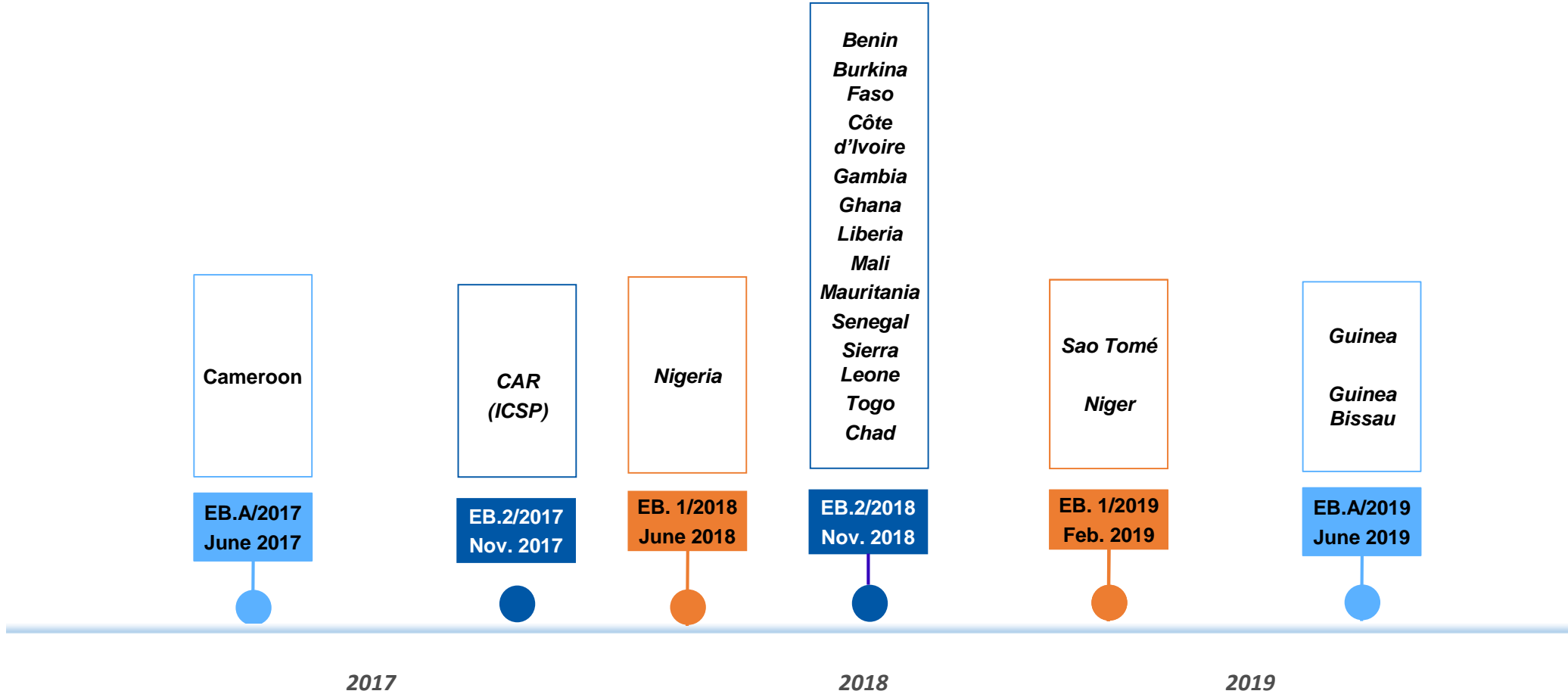

Integrated Road Map



Highlights		
CBT	USD 94 m	Value of cash transfers to 1 million people in 2017
P4P	57%	Food procured on local and regional markets, of which 20% to smallholder farmers
CLIMATE	USD 10 m	First ever allocation from Green Climate Fund to Senegal
STAFF	40%	National staff converted to fixed terms contracts
UNHAS	61,000	Relief workers transported to 82 destinations across countries in West Africa
USD	60%	Funding received towards 40 operations across 19 countries
