

Burkina Faso:

ON WATCH

Situation

- Humanitarian needs on the rise amid escalating insurgent violence in the northern and eastern provinces
- 82,000 people displaced by conflict, 440 schools closed impacting over 66,000 children
- 307,000 people currently in crisis level of food insecurity
- 17 out of 35 provinces impacted by fodder deficit support needed to mitigate deteriorating livestock body condition in pastoral lean season (March)

Response

- Preparedness measures to respond to mounting humanitarian needs
- WFP provides food assistance to 90,000 people, including 28,000 IDPs



<u>Outlook</u>: 100,000 additional people could require humanitarian assistance over the next 6 months; 676,000 people projected to experience crisis and emergency levels of food security

Cameroon

North West and South West Crisis

- 4 provinces affected (North West, South West, Littoral and West)
- 1.3 million people in need
- 438,000 people internally displaced

WFP Response:

- WFP reached 60,000 people so far with food assistance
- In 2019, WFP is scaling up its support to 400,000
 IDPs and local host populations

FAO Response:

- FAO reached **10,000 people** at the end of 2018
- Critical support needed to improve data collection and processing for Cadre Harmonisé exercise



DR CONGO

- **13.1 million** people are food insecure (IPC, Aug 2018)
- Since the 10th Ebola outbreak was declared in August
 2018, over **790 cases** have been reported
- Risk of regional spill over, as unrest in North Kivu continues to drive displacements

WFP Response:

 WFP plays active role enabling the medical response, through food assistance, logistical support and the provision of common services to the response community.
 150,000 Ebola-affected people receiving food assistance so far

FAO Response:

 2018, 1 million people assisted. In 2019, FAO plans to reach 1.8 million people in DRC to protect and restore livelihoods and support income-generating activities and links to markets





Afghanistan

- 13.5 million Afghans projected to be facing acute food deficits from November 2018 to February 2019.
- Preliminary production estimates indicated that the 2018 wheat harvest would be the lowest since 2011.

FAO response:

- FAO is currently reaching about 1 million people in time for the planting season and with livestock support.
- 2019 priorities: summer planting, preparing for emerging threats (flash floods, pests), protecting livestock

WFP Response:

WFP targets 5.7 million people in 2019. WFP assisted
 4.2 million people from January-December 2018, including 2.5 million for its 2018 drought response



South Sudan

- **5.2 million people** projected to be IPC Phase 3+ between January and March
- Anticipated early start to lean season

FAO Response:

- FAO reached 3.1 million people with 4,800 tonnes of seeds for 2018 season – accounting for about one-third of total cereal produced
- In 2019, FAO will continue increasing resilience-building activities alongside support to safeguard livelihoods

WFP Response:

- 2019: large-scale humanitarian assistance, enhanced resilience building, preparing for potential returns
- WFP plans to assist **5.1 million** people in 2019 and delivers food to **200,000** people in hard-to-reach areas



El Niño

- 90% chance of El Niño forming between December 2018 and February 2019 (December, CPC IRI ENSO probability forecast)
- Southern Africa, Central America most at risk of drought/dry spells

FAO Response:

 Early actions initiated in late 2018 to mitigate the effects of El Niño-induced drought in Madagascar, Malawi, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe

WFP Response:

In 2019, WFP is scaling up operations to reach 4.1
 million people in Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar,
 Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe



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
