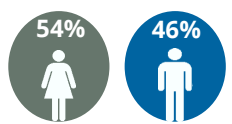

Highlights

Situation Update

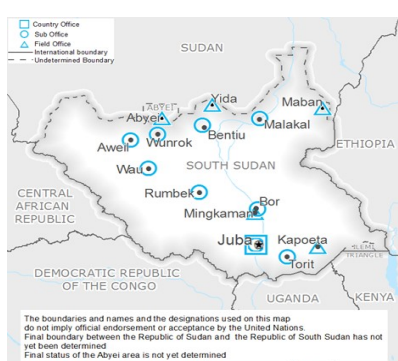
- Representatives of the JTC from WFP in South Sudan and Sudan, as well as the Governments of South Sudan and Sudan, convened a joint meeting to review the cross border humanitarian corridor operation. The meeting took place in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, between 2—4 July 2019. The parties agreed to extend the existing Memorandum of Understanding for the period between July 2019 - June 2020. The parties also made firm commitments of saving lives and working together to address the ongoing humanitarian access challenges between the two countries.
- WFP has commenced the implementation of the African Development Bank grant capacity strengthening activities, which are part of the 43.57 million USD grant for the Short-Term Regional Emergency Response Project.

WFP Response



Food and Nutrition Assistance

- WFP and Cooperating Partners reached around 3.22 million people with a total of approximately 28,233 mt of food and \$3.29 million in cash in South Sudan in May.
- WFP registered up to 1,031,770 people in SCOPE, including the recent import of 53,600 beneficiaries from IOM (excluding ongoing registrations and pending uploads). Export of WFP SCOPE beneficiaries to IOM (197,000) is expected in the first week of July-2019. Additionally, thanks to the effort of WFP partners Welthungerhilfe, World Vision International and ACTED, 60,000 beneficiaries are being registered in SCOPE in Bentiu, Malakal, Wau, Wunrock and Aweil.





Supply Chain

- WFP South Sudan Logistics Team received the 'WFP's Best Team 2018' Award from the Executive Director in Rome, Italy on 26 June. The award was in recognition of the exceptional qualities the team displayed towards saving lives and changing lives in South Sudan. Throughout 2018, the team worked hard to preposition commodities across the country making significant cost efficiency gains through the enhanced use of surface and river transport which led to reduction in the use of air transport.
- WFP is constructing six new mechanical workshops in Aweil, Bentiu, Bor, Kuajok, Rumbek and Wau sub-offices, in addition to the existing ones. The workshops will have a variety of facilities required by mechanics to maintain vehicles which deliver much needed humanitarian assistance in South Sudan.



Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning (MEAL)

- WFP released its first [Quarterly Monitoring Report](#) for the period January-March 2019, which summarizes the monitoring activities undertaken under the first quarter of the year. The report highlights the increase in coverage of regular monitoring of WFP activities, the results of a baseline survey for the implementation of a urban conditional cash-transfer programme and efforts to advance the activation of formal Complaints and Feedback Mechanisms (CFM) across all field office locations. WFP plans to share the report on a quarterly basis, focusing on its monitoring activities, processes and results of its programmes on a more frequent basis.



Safety Nets & Resilience

- WFP participated in an Integrated Resource Management (IRM) workshop organised by Cordaid on behalf of the Partnership for Resilience, a consortium of government NGOs from the Netherlands. The workshop sought to share and discuss experiences on IRM among key government ministries, UN, NGOs and academic institutions. WFP shared a presentation on the resilience programme design framework in South Sudan.

Clusters and Common Services



Logistics Cluster

- Over the last two weeks, the Logistics Cluster facilitated the transport of 512 mt of humanitarian items via road, river and air to 28 locations on behalf of 32 organizations including National NGOs such as Nile Hope and UN Agencies such as UNHCR.
- The most recent Access Constraints Map can be found at this link [here](#). A significant degradation of the main roads is to be noted due to ongoing rainy season.
- For the first time since 2016, the Logistics Cluster successfully coordinated a convoy to Kajo Keji on 26 June.
- As WFP focal point for EVD Preparedness, the Logistics Cluster participated at the UN-wide Table Topic Exercise (TTX) hosted by UNMISS on 2 July.



UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- Over the last two weeks, UNHAS transported 3,752 passengers and 69.19 mt of light humanitarian cargo to 53 destinations across South Sudan.
- UNHAS performed 8 medical evacuations on behalf of 8 organizations from Maban, Duk Padiet, Aweil, Nyal, Yiroi, Rubkona, Ulang and Pibor.
- In support of the UNICEF family reunification project, UNHAS flew 8 children to be reunited with their families.
- UNHAS performed 5 passenger charter flights on behalf of UNDP, USAID, Logistic Cluster and WHO.
- Security relocation from Mankien was performed for 8 NGO staff.
