In 2017, FAO aims to support 14 million people So far, we have reached 9 million people

FAO has reached 64% of its target

Protecting livelihoods is the best defence against famine

Producing their own food is cost effective

In Nigeria, a crop kit costs \$86 providing 6 months of food for a family In Somalia, it costs 40 cents to protect a goat and \$40 to replace it

1 goat provides 1/2 litre of milk for a child each day

and can generate 430 kg of fresh fish monthly

In Yemen, multi-nutrient blocks cost \$4

3 600 goats to restock herds 900 women-headed households



Somalia – FAO update on situation



3.1 million people severely food insecure

25% of total population risk of famine continues is worst affected areas



Harvest of 2017 main season "Gu" 37% below average



Poor conditions for livestock

low milk production and low birth rates herds shrunk by 40 to 60 percent



Somalia – FAO update on response

FAO animal health campaign 21 million livestock treated benefiting over 3 million people

multi nutrient blocks 43 640 families



South Sudan – FAO update on situation

6 million people severely food insecure

highest amount ever recorded in South Sudan increase of 1 million people since February (when Famine was declared)



1st season crop production expected below average Food access constrained (widespread insecurity and large-scale displacements, high food prices, market disruptions and limited incomegenerating opportunities)

48 000 families

to benefit from seed fairs and livelihood kits for 2nd planting season



Yemen – FAO update on situation

17 million people severely food insecure

60% of total population



Agricultural livelihoods important income source Domestic cereal crop production very limited High prices and shortage of agricultural inputs



Yemen – FAO update on response



FAO reached 595 000 people emergency livelihood support

1.3 million sheep and **goats** treated, vaccinated and received animal feed



>16 000 families

received crop and vegetable kits

1 in 10 people in rural areas suffer from acute hunger

2 missed agricultural seasons

Ethiopia FAO update on response

8.5 million people need food aid
Impact of drought will continue until 1st quarter of 2018
Widespread livestock losses
Fall armyworm reported in 411 woredas
