



Operational Context

Haiti ranks 163rd of the 188 countries on the 2016 Human Development Index. Haiti has one of the highest levels of chronic food insecurity in the world, more than half of its total population is chronically food insecure, and 22 percent of children are chronically malnourished. Underlying drivers of this situation include extreme poverty and frequent natural disasters. On the 2017 Climate Risk Index, Haiti is third among the countries most affected by extreme weather events.

WFP has been working in Haiti since 1969. WFP's first priority is to support the Haitian Government in developing sustainable solutions to hunger malnutrition with the goal to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 2 "Zero Hunger".

Operational Updates

Zero Hunger Strategic Review

In August, the National Food Sovereignty and Food Security and Nutrition Policy and Strategy was finalized. It will be presented to the Government for validation.

School Meals

During the month of August, CRS organized 4 trainings with teachers and school directors to raise their awareness about the important role they are expected to play to increase students' academic performance. These trainings gathered a total of 137 participants.

Social Protection

- In August, the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labour (MAST) officially took over the leadership of the Kore Lavi programme in two departments. On 7 August, the handover ceremony took place in Port de Paix, Nord-Ouest department and on 30 August, in Hinche, Centre department.
- WFP continued to conduct household surveys, in partnership with IOM, in "Les Anglais" (South department). A total of 6,194 households were newly registered in SIMAST, the Ministry of Social Affairs' Information System.

Food Assistance for Assets

WFP is starting cash-for-assets activities with a focus on Disaster Risk Reduction in partnership with the Direction of Protection Civile (DPC), the Ministry of Agriculture and its departmental entities (DDA) in Artibonite, Nord, Nord-Est and Sud departments. WFP aims to implement three activities: rehabilitation of communal canals, rehabilitation of schools that could be used as shelters during a disaster and rehabilitation of gabions.

Strategic Result 1: Everyone has access to food

Strategic Outcome 1: Households in affected areas have access to sufficient and adequate food to meet their basic food needs after a shock

Focus area: Crisis Response

Activities:

 Provide unconditional food assistance to families affected by shocks

Strategic Outcome 2: Nutritionally vulnerable households in areas with a high prevalence of chronic food insecurity have access to nutritious food during the lean season.

Focus area: Resilience building

Activities:

Provide nutritious-sensitive, targeted seasonal food assistance

Strategic Outcome 3: Pre-primary and primary school-aged children have adequate access to nutritious food all year long

Focus area: Root Causes

Activities:

- Provide daily nutritious school meals
- Support policy implementation for school feeding

Strategic Result 3: Smallholders have improved food security and nutrition through improved productivity and incomes

Strategic Outcome 4: Food insecure vulnerable smallholders have more resilient livelihoods to meet their food security and nutritious needs

Focus area: Resilience building

Activities:

- Provide support to smallholder farmers to sell agricultural products
- Food Assistance for Assets

Strategic Result 5: Countries have strengthened capacities to implement the SDGs

Strategic Outcome 5: Governmental institutions and other organizations have enhanced capacities to address food insecurity and malnutrition by 2030

Focus area: Root Causes

Activities:

- Provide assistance to the national social protection safety net programme
- Provide technical assistance in Emergency Preparedness and Response and assessments

Cash-Based Transfers

- In August, WFP finalized the first draft of the technical guidelines of cash-based transfers in emergencies.
- WFP finalized the list of beneficiaries for the first cycle of cash-based transfers of an ECHO-funded activity, which will take place in September. Cashbased transfers will support food insecure households in IPC 3 (Integrated Phase Classification, stress level) and IPC 4 (crisis level) in Artibonite Department.

Emergency Preparedness

 For the hurricane season, WFP is ready to respond with an in-kind contingency stock to cover the needs of 300,000 people for a month. WFP can also provide cash transfers to 150,000 people within its contingency plan.

Monitoring

- In August, the M&E unit interviewed more than 700 beneficiaries on their current food security situation during their registration for cash-for-asset projects for vulnerable and food insecure households.
- WFP also worked on the review and improvement of the School Feeding survey forms, in collaboration with one of its key partners, the Bureau Nutrition et Développement (BND). These surveys are used to monitor and assess the preparation of school meals.
- WFP's hotline aims to provide feedback and strengthen WFP's monitoring system. Most calls were related to Food Assistance for Assets activities concerning the payment schedule.

Vulnerability Analysis and Mapping

 In August, the National Coordination of Food Security (CNSA) published a note alerting to the drought due to low precipitations since the month of May. WFP continued to provide technical support to the CNSA for the monitoring of the drought in certain areas of the country.
