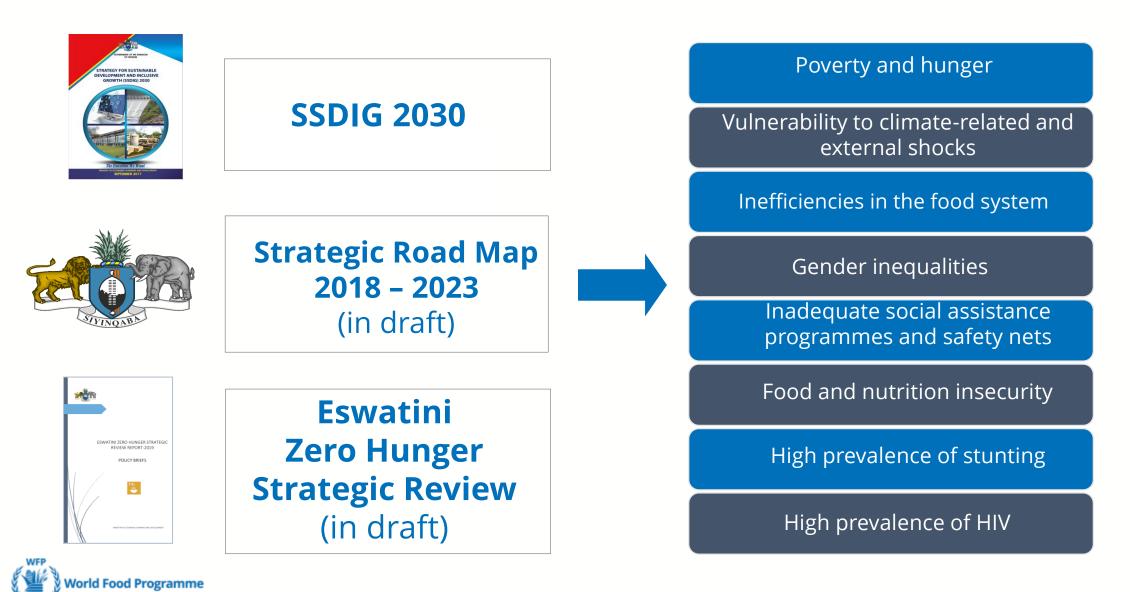
Eswatini food and nutrition security context

A lower middle-income and food-deficit country, with a population of 1.1 million people

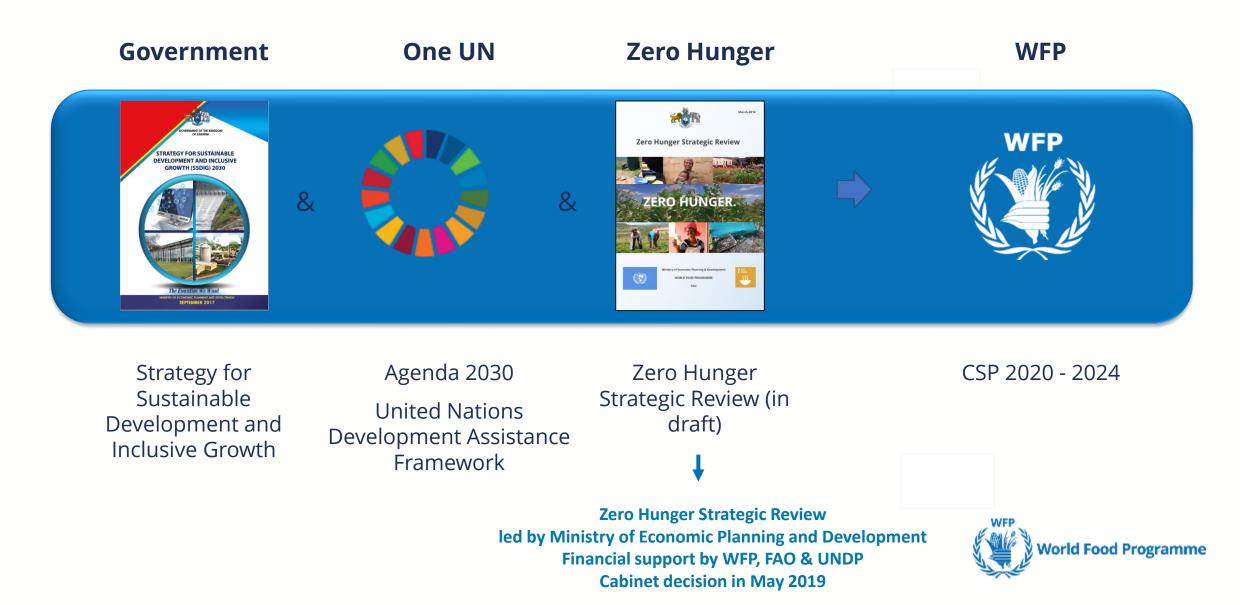
- Persistently high levels of poverty, food insecurity and undernutrition
 - **70 percent** of the country's rural population lives below the poverty line
 - **25 percent** is considered extremely poor
 - **26 percent** of children under the age of 5 are stunted
- A considerable, growing and vulnerable youth population
 - Over **46 percent** of the population is under the age of 20
 - **45 percent** of children are orphaned and vulnerable
- The highest prevalence of HIV/AIDS globally at 26 percent
- Considerable vulnerability to weather-related shocks
 - 77 percent of the rural population relies on subsistence rain-fed agriculture
- Women and girls experience disproportionate levels of vulnerability
 - **50 percent** of young women are unemployed
 - **35 percent** of women and girls are living with HIV/AIDS
