## 1. RATIONALE

- 1. The present revision (BR2) is required to allow WFP to respond to increased needs in relation to humanitarian air service provision and align the Country Strategic Plan (CSP) with the service provision agreement signed between WFP Aviation and ECHO requesting WFP to manage the ECHO Flight programme in Mali in 2020. ECHO confirmed the funding for this service provision activity in February 2020.
- 2. Furthermore, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, WFP Mali's priority is to ensure the continuity of life-saving support to vulnerable populations, securing a safe environment for the provision of food and nutrition assistance and safeguarding the health and wellbeing of staff, partners as well as the communities we support. To uphold this commitment, critical adjustments are required to the planned approaches of the integrated package of resilience activities to secure its implementation and preserve resilience gains. As such, WFP will immediately increase the use of unconditional safety nets to sustain support to the most vulnerable communities targeted with assistance under Strategic Outcomes 3 and 4.

### 2. CHANGES

## Strategic orientation

- 3. The strategic focus as set out in the CSP document remains unchanged. The present budget revision aims to:
  - Include an air service provision stand-alone service delivery activity which will cover the service provision to carry out ECHO flights, aimed at supporting and increasing humanitarian access;
  - ii. Reflect adjustments to the intervention strategy under the resilience outcomes.

## Strategic outcomes

- 4. No new strategic outcomes will be introduced through this budget revision. The Line of Sight will be adjusted to include an additional service delivery activity "Activity 10: Provision of Humanitarian Air Service in Support of DG-ECHO Funded Projects", in light of the multi country request from ECHO for this service delivery and taking into account the decision memo to have ECHO flights as standalone activities.
- 5. Due to the impact of COVID-19 and in light of the risk of large scale shocks, WFP Mali is proposing to adjust Strategic Outcomes 3 and 4 to include unconditional safety nets to

complement or temporarily replace the planned provision of conditional transfers. The COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions put in place by the Government of Mali will have a significant impact on living conditions of those furthest behind, increasing the need for social protection activities and enhanced social safety nets. Even though certain conditionality will not be implementable in light of restrictions, it is important to maintain the transfers to targeted communities to help them to absorb the shock. Through the integration and extension of this modality, WFP seeks to avoid further deterioration of the food security and nutrition situation and mitigate risks related to the adoption of negative coping mechanisms. WFP will thereby safeguard current resilience gains and support early recovery for communities whose livelihoods will be impacted by COVID-19 or other shocks in the future. Through this budget revision, WFP seeks to fully integrate unconditional transfers as integral part of the resilience package and allow an adjustement of the package to increase the share of unconditional shock responsive safety nets in case of crisis and shocks. This will be effective for the timeframe of the CSP, given other similar shocks may occur and need to be factored in.

## Beneficiary analysis

- 6. The proposed budget revision will not affect the number of beneficiaries. All beneficiary figures and the targeting strategy remains unchanged with the proposed changes to activities 4 and 5 reflecting a shift from conditional to unconditional transfers only.
- 7. While the extent of the impact of COVID-19 remains uncertain in Mali, WFP Mali foresees the need to provide additional assistance to cover the food needs of persons affected by COVID-19. WFP Mali is finalising the projections for such provisions and will reflect new beneficiary caseloads (to be targeted under Strategic Outcome 1) within a subsequent budget revision once projected needs have been outlined.

## **Transfers**

- 8. As a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the livelihoods and nutritional status of vulnerable populations will be negatively impacted and some will need additional safety nets to safeguard resilience gains.
- 9. In light of this reality, under outcome 3 /activity 4, WFP will transfer part of the cash and food assistance foreseen under the cash for nutrition awareness to immediate safety nets aimed at adressing schocks leading to acute malnutrition, thus ensuring targeted populations have access to moderate acute malnutrition treatment and prevention measures where needed.
- 10. Under outcome 4 / activity 5, WFP will secure unconditional safety nets in the form of food assistance to vulnerable population to help them cope with the impact of COVID-19 and the lean season, given asset creation interventions will need to be suspended in case of deterioration of the situation to prevent a risk of expansion of COVID 19 amongst the most vulnerable targeted by the interventions.

#### OUTPUTS:

- Crisis-affected beneficiaries (tier 1) receive timely and adequate food and cash-based transfers (output category A) that meet their food requirements and stabilize livelihoods without contributing to tensions in the case of conflict-related crises (SDG 16).
- Crisis-affected acutely malnourished children and pregnant and lactating women and girls, including caregivers (tier 1), receive adequate and timely specialized nutritious foods (output category A&B) and other services that prevent and treat malnutrition (WFP Strategic Result 2)

ACTIVITY 1: Provide an integrated food assistance package to vulnerable men, women, boys and girls affected by crisis based on a needs assessment and ensure that preparedness measures are taken to support a response that is timely, effective, efficient, equitable and in line with the national safety nets strategy [modalities: food, cash-based transfers, capacity strengthening, service delivery]

ACTIVITY 2: Provide an integrated nutrition package, including both preventative and treatment elements, to vulnerable men, women, boys and girls affected by crisis based on a needs assessment [modalities: food, cash-based transfers, capacity strengthening, service delivery

#### OUTPUTS:

 Targeted schoolchildren (tier 1), every day they attend school (output category A &N), receive school meals that meet their basic food and nutrition needs (WFP Strategic Result 1) and support school enrotment (SDG 4).

ACTIVITY 3: Provide school meals to girls and boys during the school year in targeted areas in a way that supports local markets and promotes girls 'enrolment [modalities: food, cash-based transfers, capacity strengthening, service delivery]

#### OUTPUTS

- Targeted children aged 6–23 months and pregnant and lactating women and girls (tier 1) receive food and cash transfers (output category A) (including specialized nutritious commodities where appropriate) that prevent mainutrition (WFP Strategic Result 2).
- Nutritionally vulnerable populations, including children and pregnant and lactating women and girls, benefit from increased access to diversified and nutritious foods (Output Category B)
- Children 6–69 months, pregnant and lactating women and girls and caregivers (tier 3) benefit from strengthened national capacities to design, implement and monitor sustainable and equitable approaches to the treatment of malnutrition (Output Category C)
- Targeted beneficiaries (tier 1) benefit from mahutrition prevention interventions (output category E), including social and behaviour change communication.

#### OUTPUTS:

- Vulnerable populations in targeted areas subject to recurrent shocks and the impacts of climate change, particularly women (tier 1), receive timely and adequate food assistance for assets creation or consolidation of resilience gains (output category A) and that meet their short-term food needs while improving their resilience
- Targeted smallholders, especially women smallholders, and other actors along the value chain (Tier 1) benefit from strengthened technical and operational capacities to improve food quality, strengthen market access and increase their incomes (Output category F)
