Due to extreme disruption in the global transport market, WFP has established supply chain services on behalf of the humanitarian and health community in alignment with the **COVID-19 Global Humanitarian Response Plan**. These services enable the health response to the COVID-19 pandemic through the transport of essential humanitarian and health cargo and personnel to destinations not currently reachable through other means.

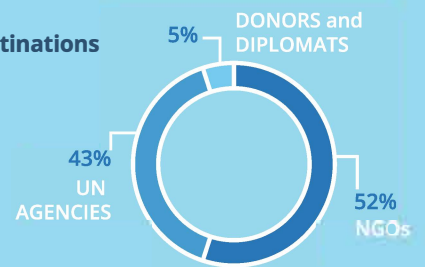
