## Highlights

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 The combined cost of essential food commodi-ties<sup>2</sup> in both camps showed an increase of 1.7% in Azraq camp and 1.1% in Zaatari camp (see Figures 1 and 2), compared with the preceding month, mainly driven by higher prices for vegetables and eggs. This basket of essential foods is 4.3% more expensive in Azraq camp than in Zaatari camp, but still well below the national average.

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and eggs -due to increase in fodder prices- which witnessed a significant increase (up to 43 percent for cucumbers).

- In September 2020, prices of some vegetables in both Azraq and Zaatari camps > displayed significant spikes ranging from +35% to +55% compared with last month. However, most prices are still below the reference price one year ago.
- During the reporting period, prices for the cheapest available staple commodi-ties<sup>3</sup> witnessed slight to moderate fluctuations ranging from -9% to +15% as compared to August 2020. Despite a temporary price stabilization starting 3 months ago, bulgur and lentils are still the staples that show the most significant long-term price increases
- Market prices for protein-rich foods (eggs, tuna, chicken) have fluctuated moderately in both camps. While the price of tuna displayed a considerable decrease, the price of eggs recorded a moderate increase by 14-17% in both camps. While the price of chicken decreased in Zaatari camp, it remained unchanged in Azraq camp.

### Zaatari Camp

- As in Azraq camp, the prices for vegetables in Zaatari camp witnessed considerable variations (from -12% for onions to +39% for cucumbers) during August 2020 compared with last month. Nevertheless, looking at long-term trends, the prices of cucumbers and tomatoes continued the upward trend from 3 months ago. In addition, both commodities are still more expensive (up to 24% for tomatoes) than one year ago. A positive development is that price of onions and potatoes eased off from last month while the price of apples remained unchanged.
- Prices for the cheapest available staple commodities displayed slight to moderate fluctuations in September 2020 (from -9% for sugar to +15% for wheat flour). A positive development is that prices of lentils and bulgur stabilized over the past 3 months after price hikes earlier this year. However, both commodities are still considerably more expansive (41% and 8% respectively) than 6 months ago.
- Prices for protein-rich foods (eggs, chicken, tuna) In Zaatari camp displayed a considerable decrease from last month (-10% for Tuna), except for eggs for which the price witnessed an increase by 17% and is now 30% more expensive y-o-y.
- Prices of salt and milk powder fell by 2% posting a decrease for the second consecutive month.

## Azraq Camp

- During September 2020, prices of vegetables in Azraq camp displayed slight to significant fluctuations (from -1% for onions and potatoes up to +55% for cucumbers) compared with August 2020. The increase in price of some vegetables was in line with the national prices but vegetables in camps remain slightly cheaper. The price of apples eased off, putting an end to an upward trend from 3 months ago.
- Prices of the cheapest available brands of staple commodities witnessed considerable decreases (from -10% for lentils to +1% for veg. oil) during the reporting period. It is noteworthy that the price of bulgur and lentils continued to stabilize after spikes since the beginning of this year.
- Prices of protein-rich foods (eggs, chicken, tuna) continued to display slight to moderate fluctuations during the reporting month. While the price for tuna fell by 4%, the price of eggs increased by 17% whereas the price of chicken remained unchanged. Notably, price of eggs is 25% more expensive from one year ago.
- A positive development is that the prices of salt showed a decrease for the second consecutive month but remains 5% more expensive compared to September 2019.

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Main source of data for camps is WFP Market price monitoring through field visits complemented by online data in WFP's Triangulation Database.
Methodology: camps reported prices reflect the average collected prices of the cheapest available food commodity in the reported period while the national prices represent the national average prices as received from the Department of Statistics in Jordan.
