Generally, market prices for the monitored food commodities, but maize grain, remained relatively stable compared to the situation 3 weeks ago. There were slight changes on maize meal and sugar beans availability.

Markets Overview

The report is based on markets from 45 districts (23 urban and 22 rural), The previous reporting period covered 40 districts (22 rural and 18 urban).

Major food commodities

Though prices of maize grain show general 8% reduction, driven by rural market prices, availability remains very low at 3% of the markets from 13 districts.

On the other hand, maize meal availability is relatively higher at an average of **51%** although **10%** lower than the previous reporting period. The commodity was available in markets across 40 out of the 45 districts monitored during the reporting period

Availability of sugar beans improved during the period under review from 60% to 67% of markets spread across 41 districts.

Cooking oil prices and availability were stable in the weeks under review a similar situation over the last two months.



Food Security and COVID-19

Both urban and rural households continue to rely on markets for food although their purchasing power remains significantly below-normal as they are yet to recover from the negative impacts of COVID-19 restrictive measures. With the easing of lockdown measures, it is likely that incomes from both urban and rural setups will start to increase thereby improving their food and nutrition security situation The main source of income for rural households - agricultural related casual labour - is likely to improve with the forecasted good rainfall across the country.

Based on WFP's mVAM national data, around 22% of households have reported challenges with their market access during October. The main challenge reported is lack of money while travel restrictions has seen a minor positive decreasing trend and reduced from 5.5% of households during the first week of October to 4.4% by 26th October. Around 3% of the interviewed households reported market/grocery store being closed.

The country started reporting an increase in the daily rate of COVID-19 cases since October 2020. Over the reporting period **341 new** cases were reported. As of 30 October 2020, the country had recorded a total of **8,362** positive cases; the total number of deaths was at **242** (12 deaths reported between the 12th and the 30th of October). The total number of active cases was estimated at **236** as of 30 October 2020.

Inflation and Exchange Rate

The annual inflation rate decreased from 761% in August to 659% in September and consequently the food inflation rate also decreased from 865% to 724%. The official and parallel market exchange rates remain stable translating into price stability as reflected in the price analysis. The foreign exchange auction was held on the **27th of October 2020** with the weighted average rate of **ZWL81.35** per dollar, remaining comparable to the **ZWL81.44:1US\$** recorded on the **9th of October 2020** (RBZ,2020). The official exchange rate was fixed at **ZWL81.35** per dollar. The parallel market exchange rate remains pegged at **ZWL100:1US\$** which is **19%** higher than the official rate (zimpricecheck.com). The cost of some goods and services such as electricity increased over the reporting period despite declining inflation and general stability in the exchange rate.

Overall market trends for food basket commodities

While prices for food commodities have been largely stable, notable price decreases have been observed for some commodities in some geographic areas when purchases are made in local currency, especially cash payments. This has been attributed to declining demand as a result of poor consumer purchasing power, low availability of cash in the market coupled with a stable exchange rate which has prompted traders to adjust prices in line with the prevailing market rates.

<u>Maize grain</u>

Maize grain remains unavailable and the situation is unlikely to improve throughout the lean season. Prices are generally stable except for recent slight decrease in rural markets. An average of 7% premium is charged on mobile

Maize meal

Average price for rural markets is 13% higher than in urban markets, and the commodity availability continues to be lower than in urban areas. Mobile money payments attracted an average premium of 5% against the ZWL cash

Sugar beans

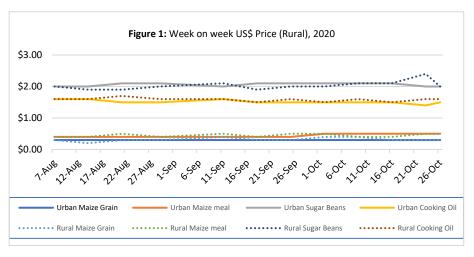
Sugar beans availability improved further to an average of 67%, and is better available in urban areas (79%). Mobile money payments attracted a premium of 6% on average in comparison to ZWL Cash payments.

Cooking oil

Availability remains high and the prices have remained relatively stable since the increase observed in June, particularly in rural areas. When compared to the 12 month average the prices have risen by 154% in rural areas and 43% in

Food Commodity Prices in Foreign Currency

According to **Figure 1**, prices for goods in US\$ have been relatively stable during the past months with slight week on week fluctuations. The average US\$ prices for maize meal (**US\$0.50/kg**) has been relatively stable and is **14%** lower than the 2-year average (**US\$0.58/kg**) and similar to the October 2019 average (**US\$0.51/kg**). In the second week of the three-week reporting period, an increase of **17%** was noted for sugar beans in rural areas while cooking oil prices in urban areas decreased by **6%**. However, the average for the reporting period is comparable to prices reported since June 2020. Despite limited



observations, the current maize grain price of US\$0.30/kg is similar to October 2019 with an average price of **US\$0.30/kg**. The US\$ prices are similar between rural and urban markets though the rural prices seems to be more volatile in comparison to the urban price.

Non-Food Commodities: Laundry and Bathing soap in ZWL terms

In the three weeks under review, the national average price of laundry soap for the current period was reported at **ZWL117.80/bar**. The average price for urban markets was **ZWL111.40/bar** while for rural it was **ZWL125.10/bar**; the trend is comparable to the previous reporting period.

The average price of bathing soap has been stable at **ZWL62.80/kg** across the country with little to no price variations between rural and urban districts. Price variations between markets were attributed to different brand with some brands being more expensive compared to others.

Rural markets - review of prices and availability

Maize Grain

Maize grain availability in rural markets remains poor at an average of **2%** across five districts out of the 22 rural districts monitored. The average selling price over the reporting period of **ZWL29.52/kg** is about **12%** lower than the **ZWL33.63/kg** reported three weeks back. Highest prices were noted in Chivi district where the selling price was at **ZWL34.80/kg** which is **20%** higher than the national average price, while the lowest price was recorded in Mbire at **ZWL25/kg**.

The continued price decrease for the commodity is indicative of the low market demand as a result of a number of factors including households consuming from own stocks/production, farmer to farmer sales and the inability of the households to purchase adequate quantities due to liquidity challenges.

Unrefined Maize Meal

The price of unrefined maize meal recorded a slight decrease at an average retail price of **ZWL44.03/kg** compared to **ZWL49.30/kg** in the last reporting period (**Figure 2**). Chipinge and Mutare reported the lowest prices which is likely a factor of the districts' proximity to Mozambique where more affordable varieties are on offer.

Maize meal was reported available in **53%** of the rural markets compared to **56%** reported previously. Districts closer to urban centres reported higher availability with districts such as Chipinge recording **88%** availability. Additionally, cereal deficit districts such as Mwenezi, Binga and Tsholotsho reported a steady supply of the commodity in at least **45%** of markets.

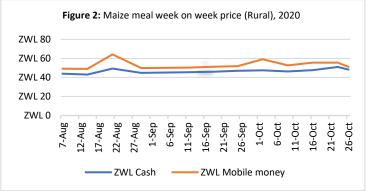
Sugar Beans

Sugar bean prices continue to decrease with the current average selling price of **ZWL165.90/kg** which is lower compared to **ZWL213.93/kg** in the previous reporting period (**Figure 3**). These price drops are likely a factor of increased market supply as reflected by the increase in availability from **49%** to **57%** in the current week. This is most likely supply coming from irrigated crops across the country increasing availability of fresh produce. This demonstrates the need for resilience building initiatives that increases the adaptive capacity of households against adverse natural and economic conditions

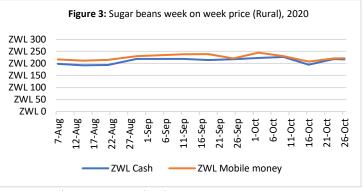
Cooking Oil

Cooking oil was available in most of the markets (97%) and the average price has been stable and comparable to the last reporting period at ZWL148.70/kg (Figure 4). Districts in Matebeleland North province generally reported higher prices at ZWL164.10/kg which is 5% higher than the national average. Districts such as Muzarabani (29%) and Marondera (23%) reported the largests price drops when compared to the previuos reporting period.

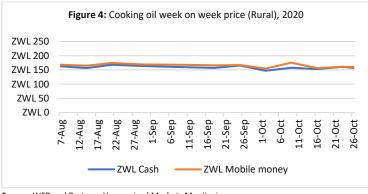

Urban markets - review of prices and availability

Maize Grain

Similarly to the last reporting period, the commodity was available in an average of **4%** of the markets, and remains slightly higher when compared to rural markets. This might be due to more demand from urban households which rely more on markets compared to rural households who might have stocks from own production. Maize grain was only available on markets in Chiredzi Urban, Gweru, Norton and Kariba Urban.

The average selling price of **ZWL26.50/kg** has been relatively stable over the reporting month although its 10% higher in when compared to the last week of August 2020. The urban average price is **8%** lower than the rural average (**Figure 5**). Traders were changing an average premium of **14%** for mobile money transactions which is comparable to the situation in rural markets.

Unrefined Maize Meal

The retail price of unrefined maize meal has been relatively stable over the last 6 weeks with slight week on week changes of less than 2% (Figure 6). The current urban price of ZWL43.85/kg is 14% lower than the rural average of ZWL50.20/kg. The highest price in the current reporting period was reported in Gokwe South urban at ZWL48.10/kg with lowest price reported in Epworth at ZWL35/kg these prices are 10% higher and 20% lower than the national average price respectively. Chegutu (26%) and Chinhoyi (18%) recorded the highest prices increases when compared to the previous period. Year on year comparison have shown that Epworth, Rusape and Hwange Urban recorded the highest price increase of over 200%.

On average, availability decreased by **5 percentage points** during the weeks under review in comparison to the previous reporting week. The commodity was available in **50%** of the markets across all 23 districts with market availability variations within districts.

Sugar Beans

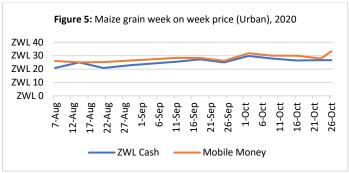
Availability of the commodity has been increasing and is currently estimated at **68%** of the markets an increase of **11 percentage points** in comparison to the previous reporting period.

Sugar beans price in urban and peri-urban districts currently trading at **ZWL197.30/kg** compared to the previous biweekly average of **ZWL198.40/kg** (**Figure 7**). Epworth recorded the highest price change with sugar bean prices increasing by **18%**, while in Norton and Chinhoyi prices increased on average by **15%**. Given these districts have the lowest prices, this increase is likely because traders here are restocking and buying the commodity at a higher price than previously, although prices are expected to remain lower than other regions due to their proximity to the capital Harare where most producers of the commodity are.

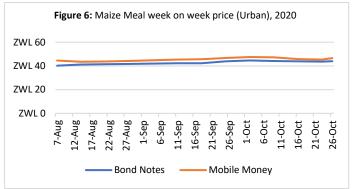
Cooking Oil

The price of cooking oil in urban markets has been relatively stable during the period under review (**Figure 8**). Prices where highest in Hwange Urban (**ZWL168.10/L**) and lowest in Epworth (**ZWL107/L**). Epworth also recorded the highest year on year increase of **230%** while Hwange urban recorded the

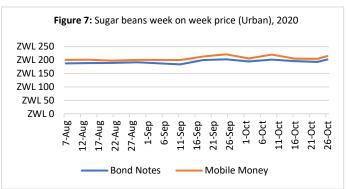
second largest price increase of **211%** followed by Gokwe South with **208%** increase. The commodity availability also remained high and stable. Chiredzi recorded the highest price increase of **13%** while Epworth recorded the largest price decrease of **12%**.



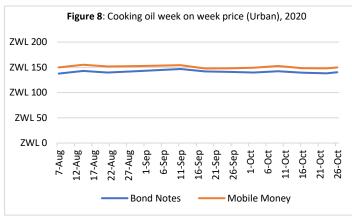

Annex 1: Sample and data collection

This report provides an update on WFP food basket commodities availability and prices. It covers the period from the 12th to 30th October 2020 and is based on interviews with 1,456 traders (782 in rural districts and 674 in urban districts) across 45 districts (22 rural and 23 urban). Annexes 10-12 explain the trend arrows used in the highlights.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions most of the data collection is virtual. In the current week the proportion of remote to face-face monitoring increased slightly from **73%** reported previously to **79%** for the reporting period (**12 to 30 October 2020**). As there are still active COVID-19 cases, partners are encouraged to use remote data collection approach.

Checking Availability at market level: If any of the interviewed traders in a market reports having sold a commodity within the last week, the commodity is considered available in this market. Availability at country-level (district-level) is calculated as the share of markets with commodity availability across the country (across districts). Missing data indicate that none of the interviewed traders generally trades the commodity.
