WFP in Cox's Bazar going green



WORK SO FAR

How we are working to **reduce, reuse and recycle** across the Cox's Bazar operation



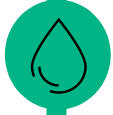
Together with the WASH Sector, the Food Security Sector has developed a **waste avoidance in emergency food assistance guidance note**



Camp 15 **upcycling center** has been up and running since September 2020 and over **half a million** WFP food packets have been upcycled into **2,500** products



Plastic-free e-voucher outlets were piloted in January 2020 and scaled-up in November



So far in 2021, WFP has cleaned almost **80km** of canals and drains across the camps



So far in 2021, in collaboration with FAO and IOM, WFP has maintained over **half a million** tree seedlings covering **219 hectares** across 19 camps

NEXT STEPS

WFP strives to take a **zero waste** approach in activity implementation and office operations



Together with FAO, WFP will promote **composting** as part of home-gardening activities in the camps and connect fresh food waste with composting facilities

WFP plans to open four new camp **up/recycling centers** while scaling-up **initiatives** in the **host community**

WFP will conduct a **feasibility study on solid waste management** with a focus on recycling drainage and construction waste

To **reduce construction waste**, including mortar, and promote **greener construction** WFP will pilot **interlocking bricks** in civil infrastructure projects

WFP will integrate **waste management and recycling education** into training activities
