

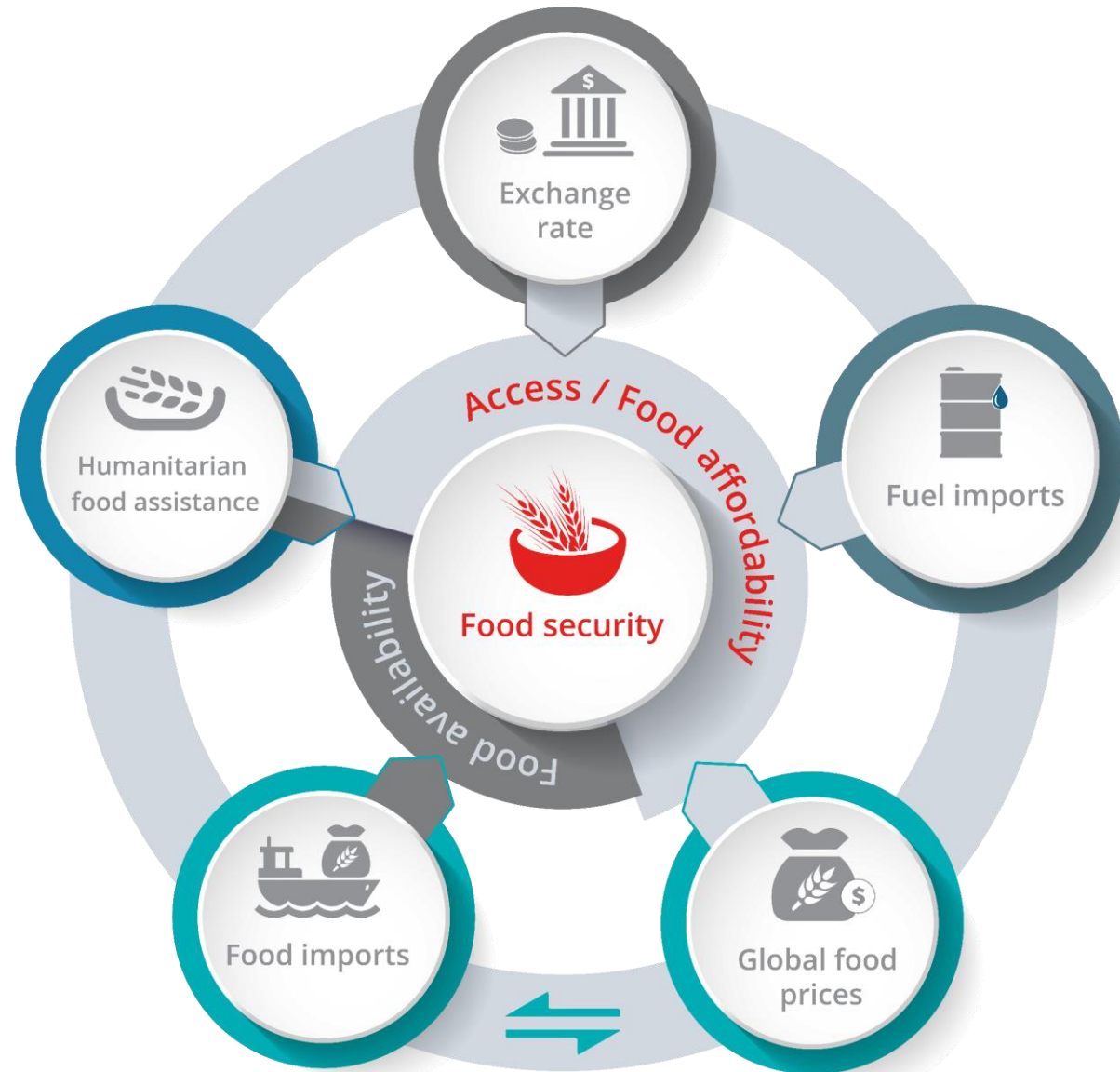

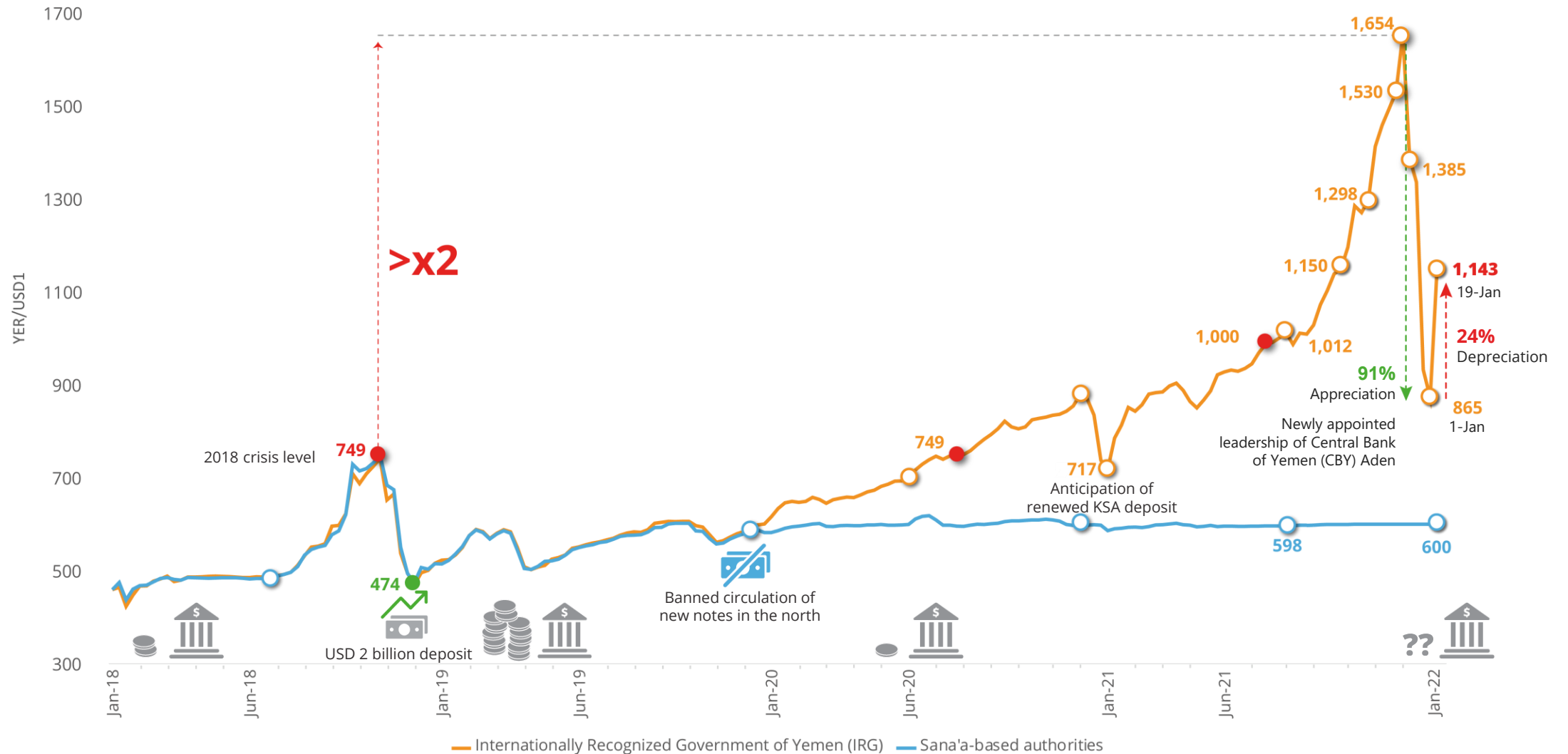

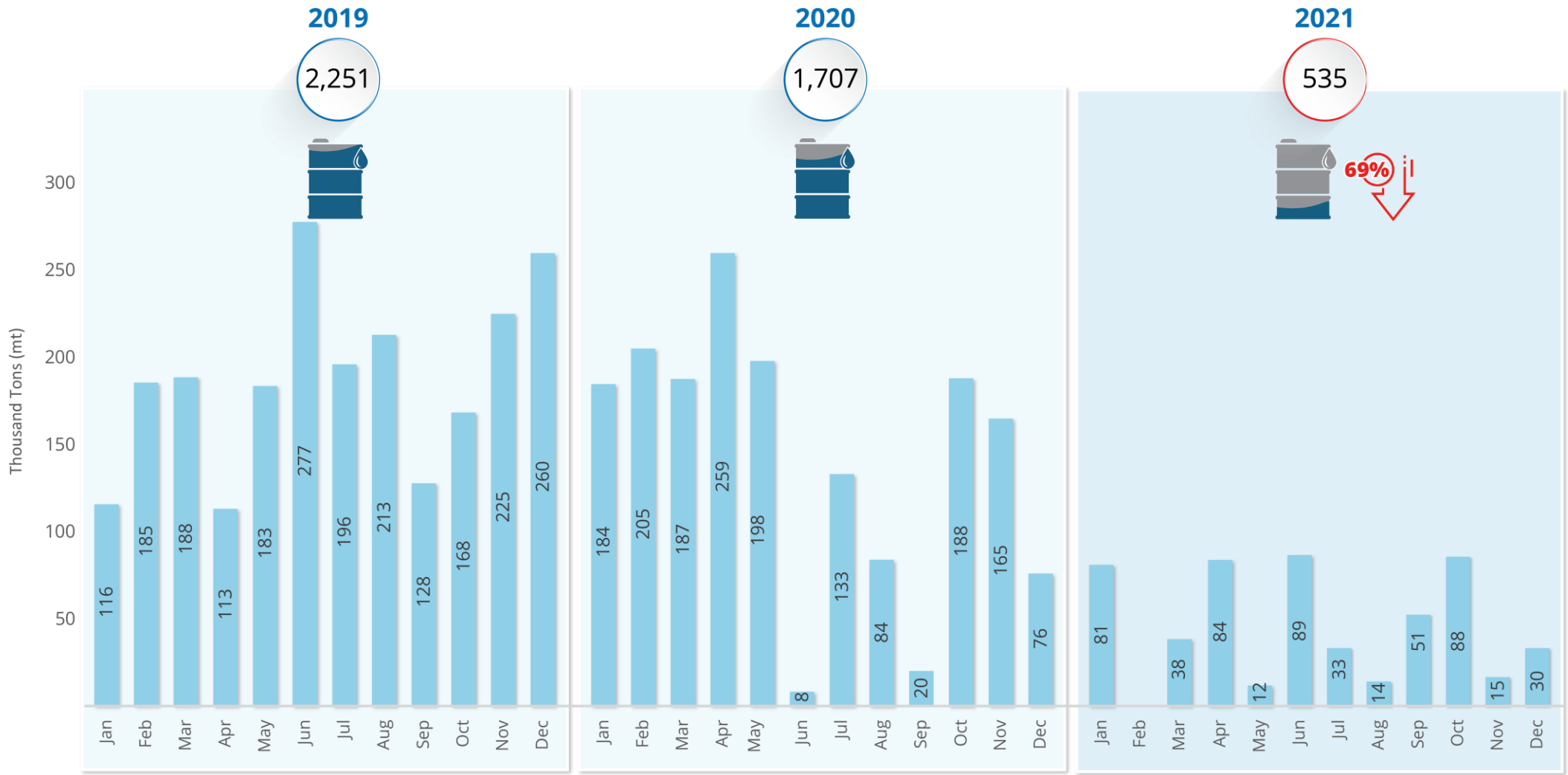


Fuel imports through Red Sea, Mukalla and Aden ports

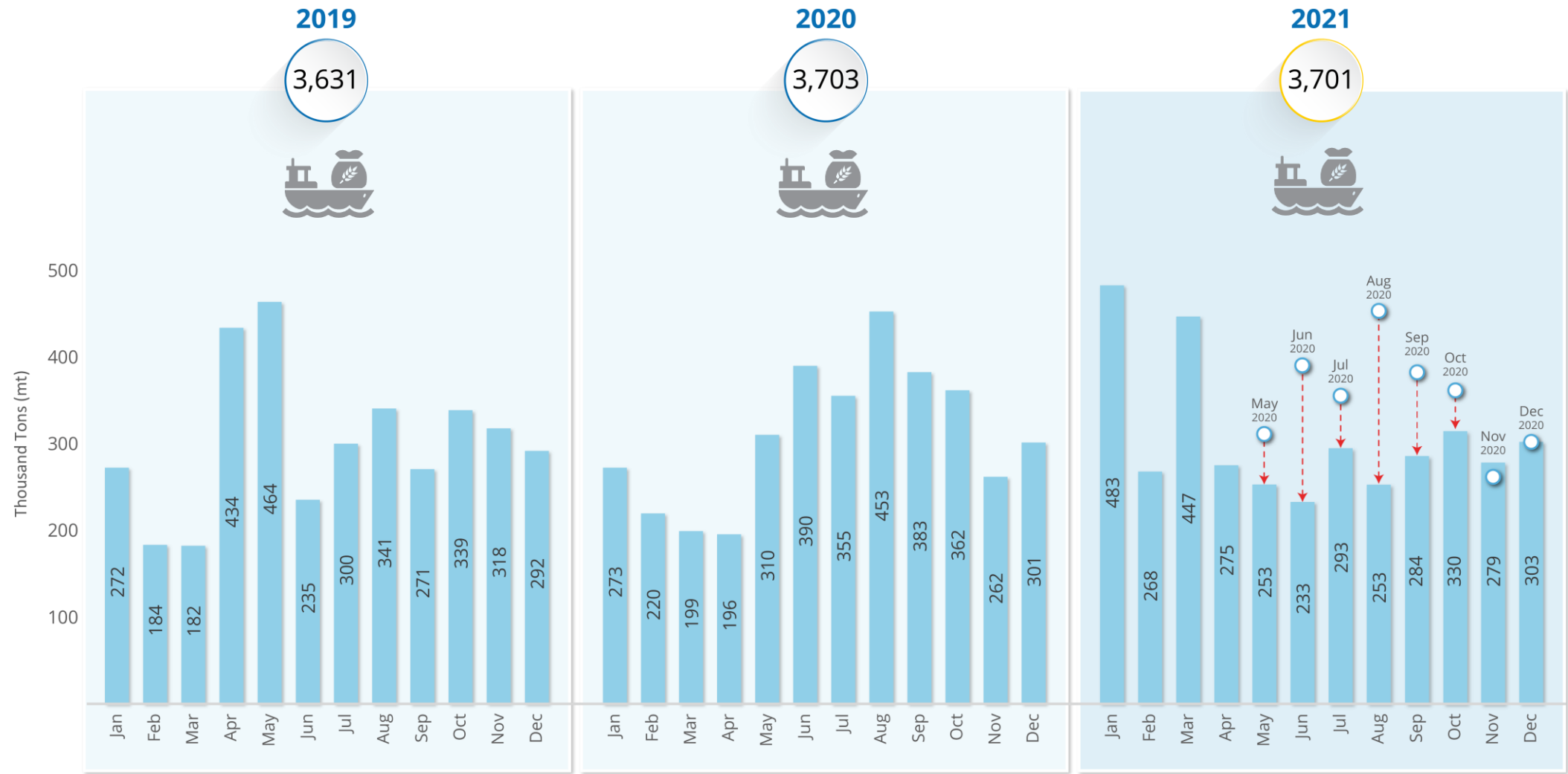

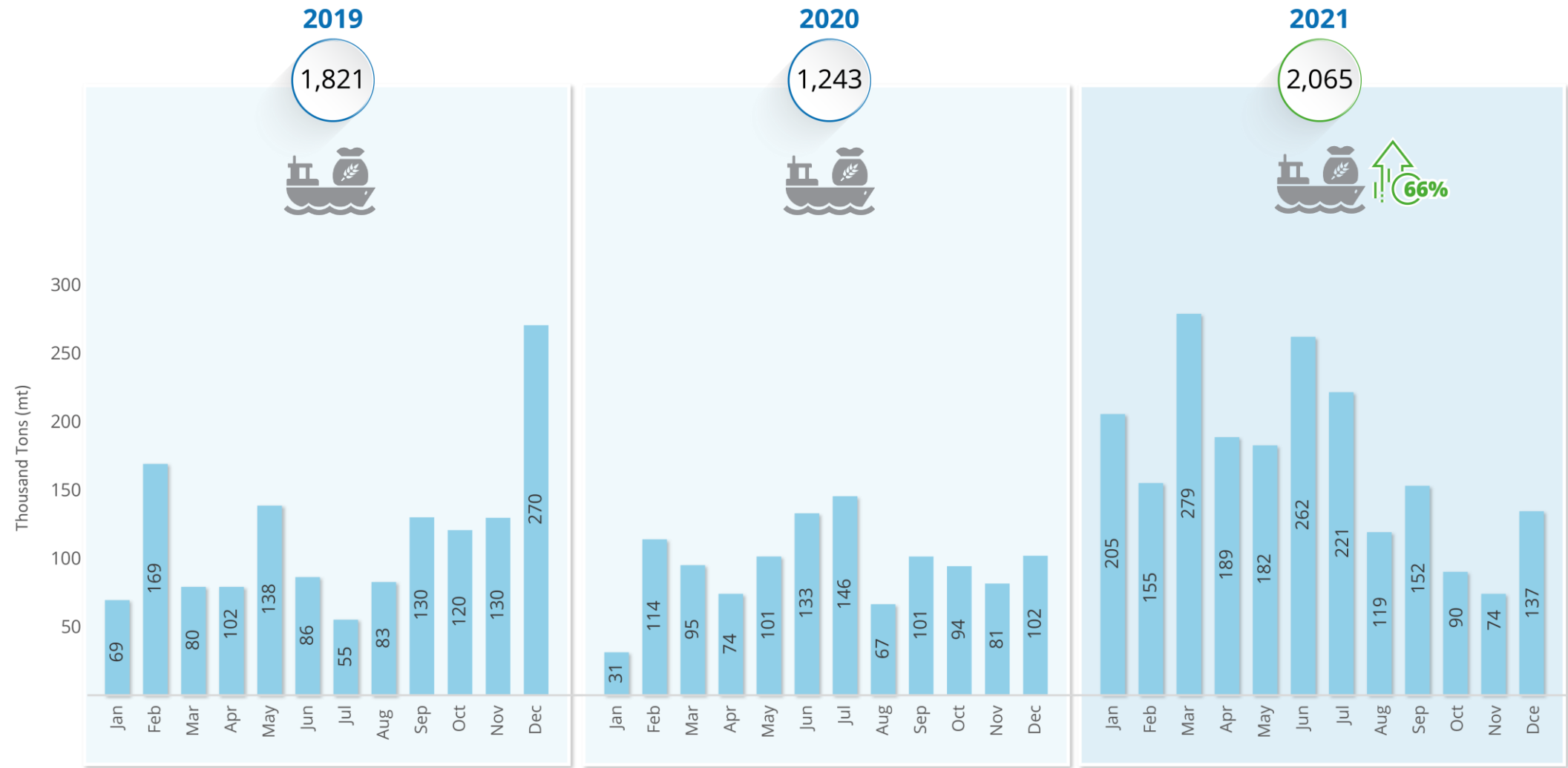
Food imports through Al Hodeidah and As Salif ports

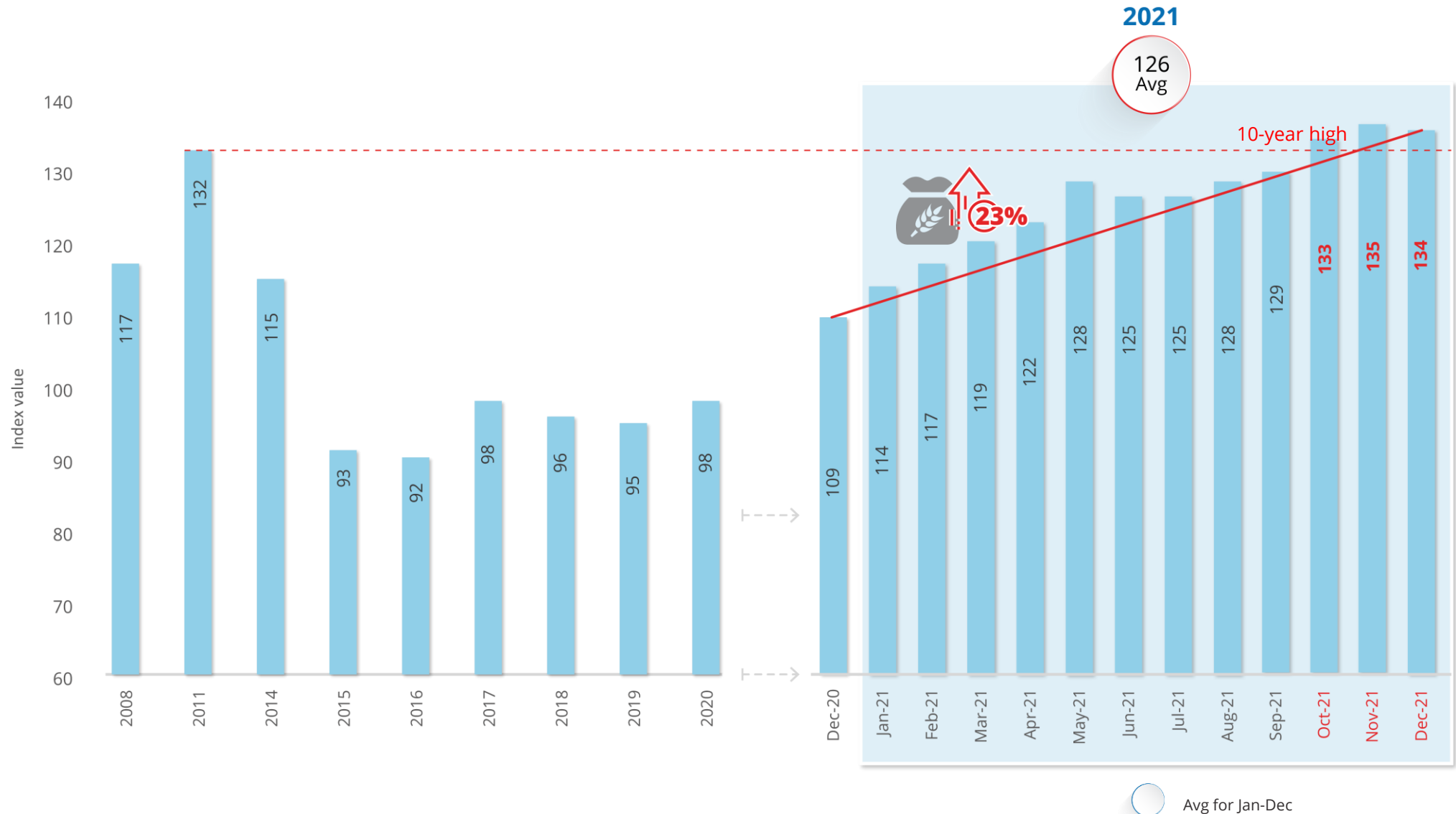
Food imports through Aden Port

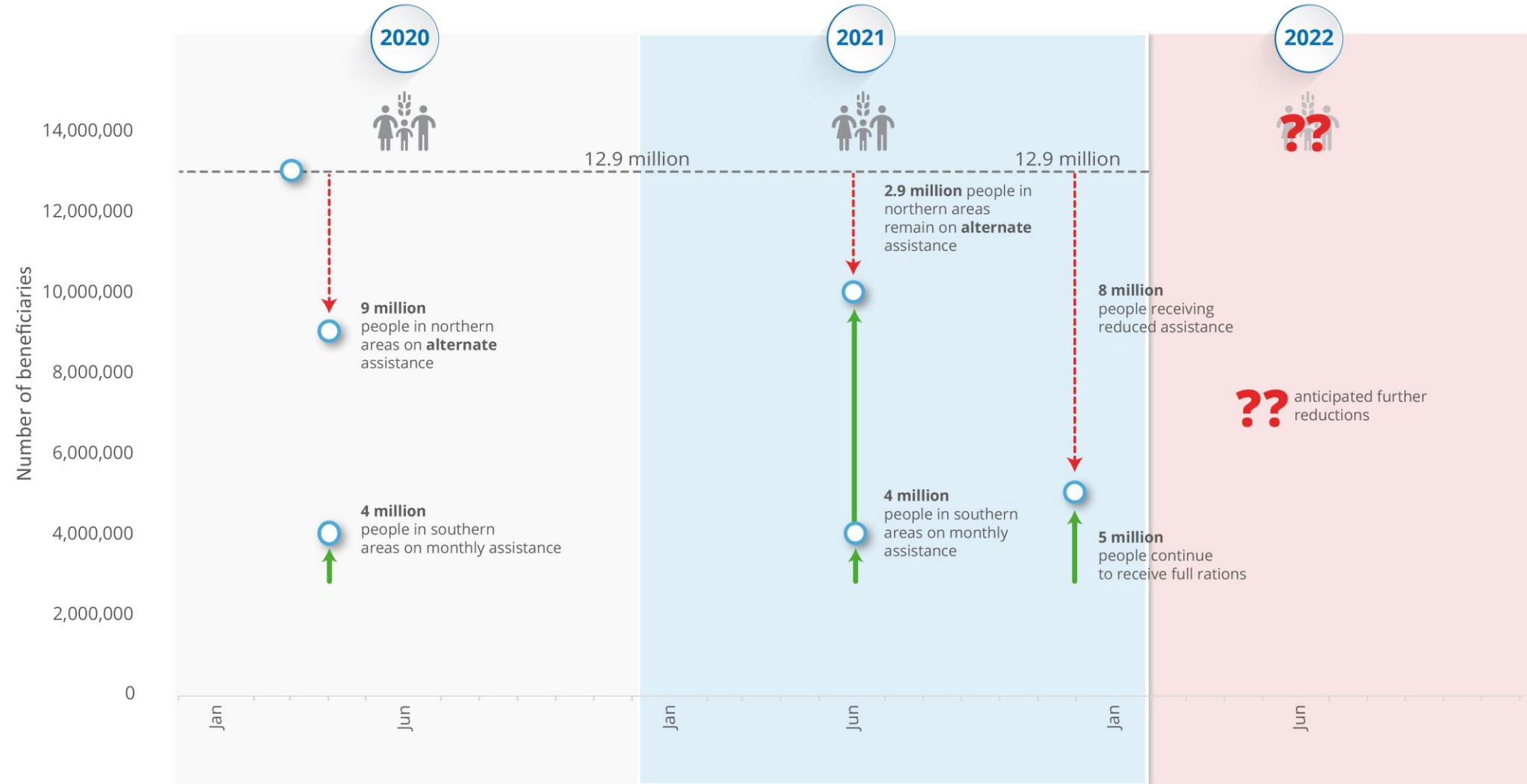
Global food prices

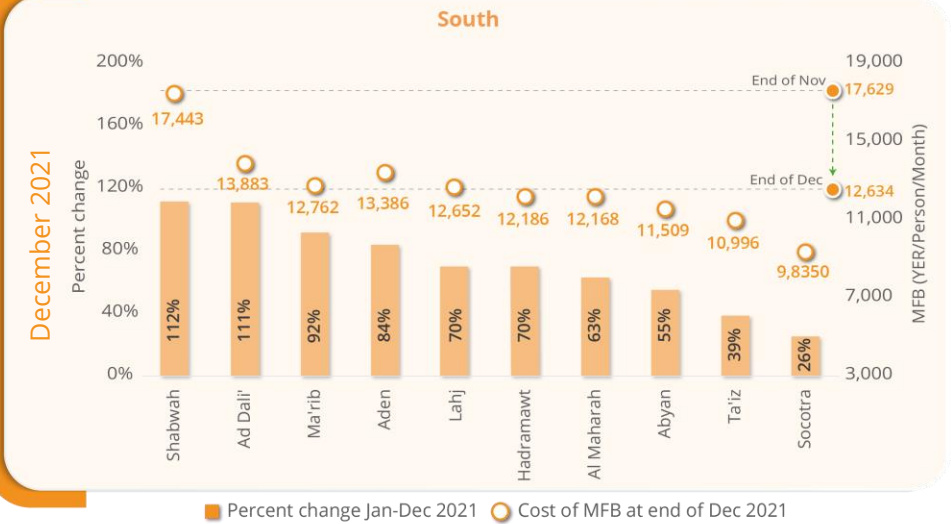
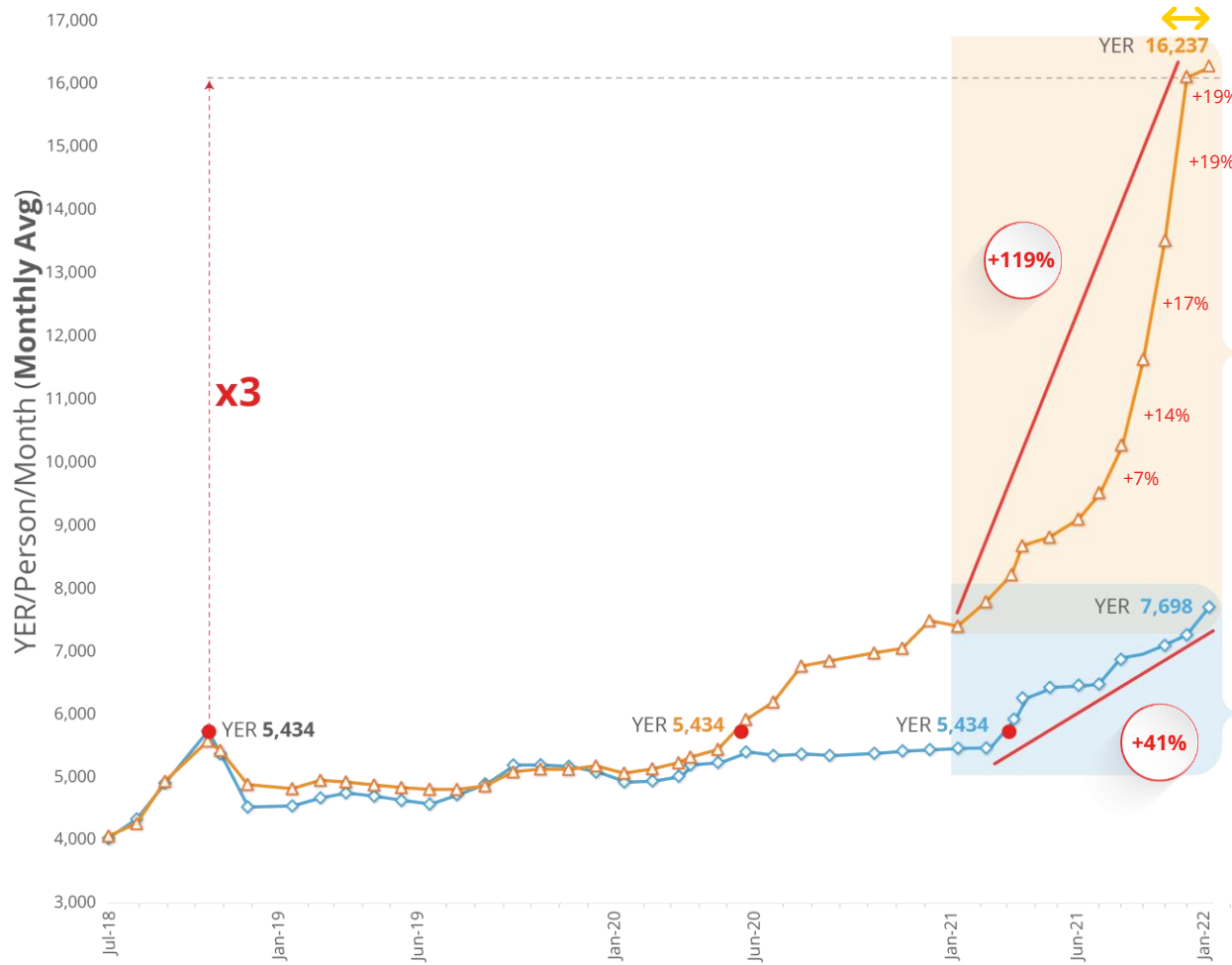


Humanitarian food assistance



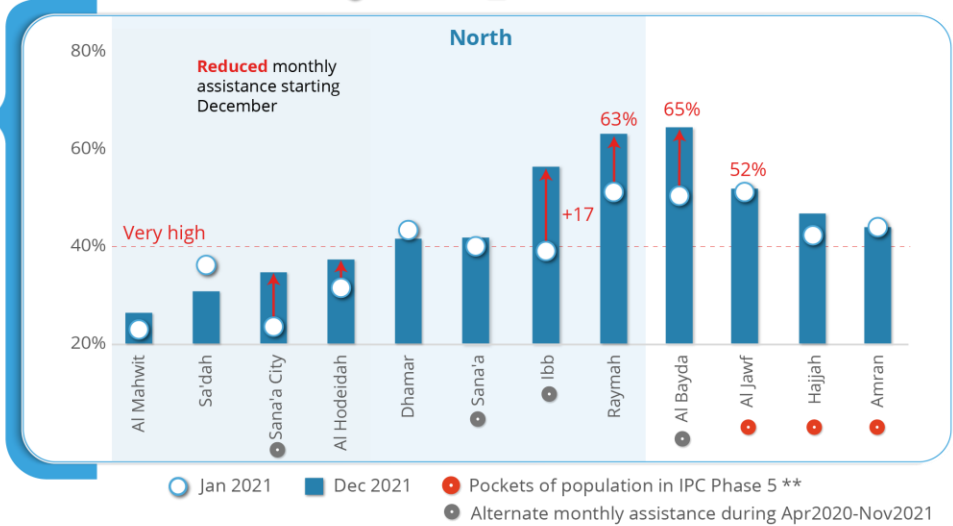
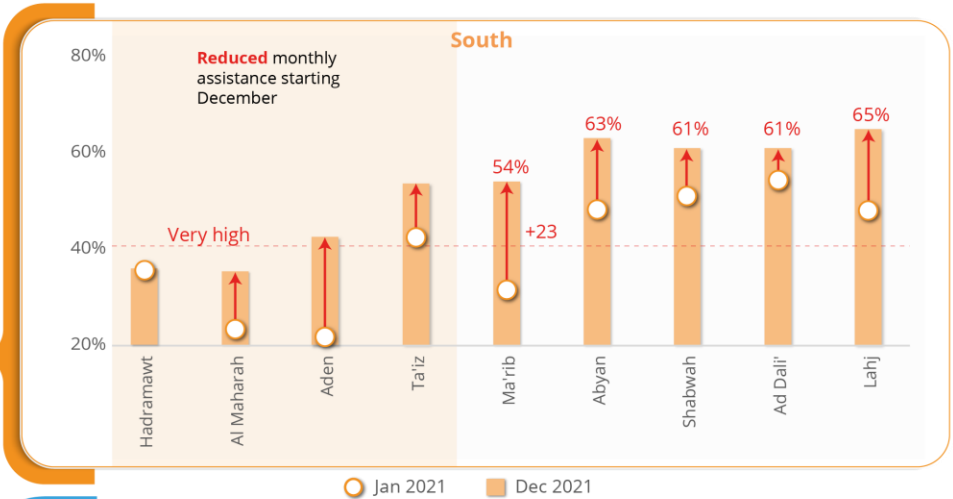
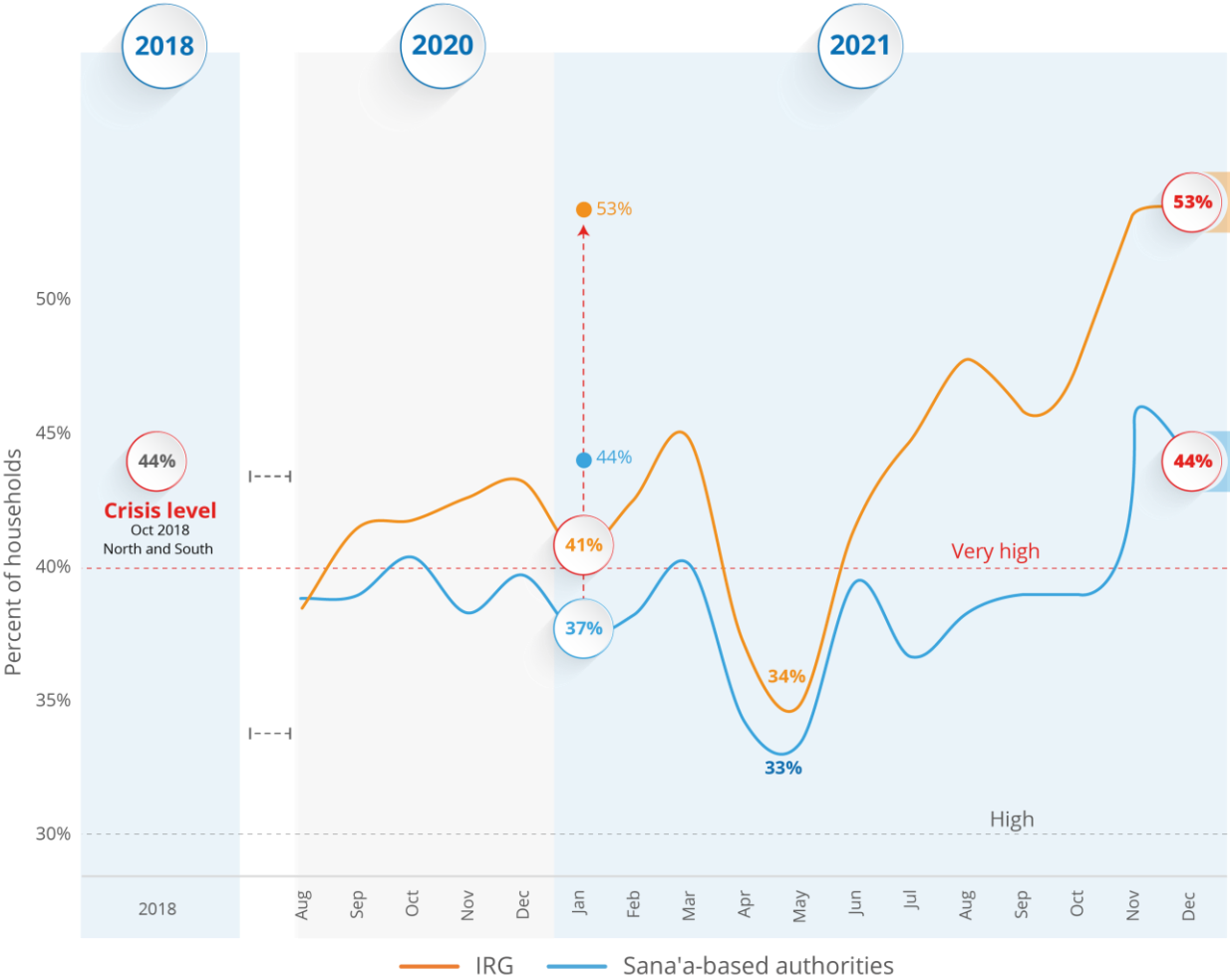


Average cost of minimum food basket (food affordability)
