#### **Rationale**

- 1. Under this budget revision, WFP will extend the current interim country strategic plan (ICSP) for 8 months to end in February 2023 and make minor adjustments to the food basket.
- 2. In late 2021, ongoing discussions between the United Nations resident coordinator and the Algerian Foreign Ministry revealed that the Ministry would require further consultations to approve the new United Nations sustainable development cooperation framework (UNSDCF) for Algeria, originally planned to enter into effect in early 2022. Consequently, the UNSDCF for Algeria has been delayed 1 year and is expected to commence in 2023. Though WFP is not officially included in the UNSDCF, WFP is committed to align itself to the UNSDCF planning cycle and will thus extend its current ICSP until February 2023, while preparing a new ICSP for submission to the Executive Board in 2023.
- 3. Following the recommendations of a school feeding review carried out in 2019, WFP is diversifying the composition of the school meal, tailoring it to local tastes and cultural habits while seeking more nutrition-sensitive options. To this effect, WFP has successfully piloted and will change its school meal to gofio porridge instead of high-energy biscuits (HEB). A November 2021 assessment estimated that the gofio school meal will also reduce the total cost of the school feeding ration by 41 percent.

# Changes

#### **Strategic orientation**

- 4. This budget revision will not change the strategic orientation of the ICSP.
- 5. The previous budget revision to this ICSP, approved by the country director in November 2021, introduced the capacity strengthening modality under outcome 2, revised the caseload of beneficiaries and rations for nutrition activities and made other minor operational adjustments to the ICSP.

#### Strategic outcomes

#### *Transfer modalities*

6. Under activity 2, the school meals ration has been revised in line with beneficiary preferences and to advance towards a more diverse composition with the introduction of gofio, a locally-preferred roasted grain flour, into the daily school meal. Gofio is prepared as a porridge, and according to the recipe, dried skimmed milk has been reduced from 80g to 29g, while 5g of sugar and 2g of vegetable oil have been added, providing a 436 kcal intake to schoolchildren per day of school attendance. WFP will continue to explore the inclusion of fortified and fresh nutritious foods in the school meals menu given the high prevalence of anaemia among Sahrawi children in the camps near Tindouf (see preliminary results of the UNHCR-WFP nutrition survey 2022).

### Supply chain challenges

7. The crisis in Ukraine has led to a sharp increase in the price of wheat flour in Algeria, with an almost five-fold increase to date compared with the first half of 2021. Barley, lentils, and vegetable oil also experienced price hikes. In many cases, the local prices of wheat and other commodities have exceeded international prices, rendering local purchase less cost effective for WFP. Consequently, WFP will flexibly source wheat flour and other commodities locally or internationally based on costs.
