# CONCLUSIONS



CSP well-aligned with national and UN priorities. Highly relevant shift from direct delivery to enabling role focused on resilience building and nutrition



A balance between responsiveness to context with coherence and alignment to CSP strategy was needed





Strong relationship with government at operational level, but closer collaboration with UN agencies and civil society needed to build evidence base and support sustainability



Shift to country capacity strengthening appreciated by stakeholders; but need to narrow WFP's strategic focus to areas of comparative advantage



Targeting well-focused on at-risk geographic areas and the most vulnerable; but few activities missed out on directly targeting some of the latter

### RECOMMENDATIONS

**Next CSP** should build on WFP's core mandates and comparative advantages that align with government priority needs

Maximize longer-term impact of WFP programming and enhance coherence across strategic outcomes and activities as well as their gender and nutrition sensitivity

Strengthen strategic and operational partnership with the Government at national and subnational level in alignment with other UN agencies
