## Rationale

1. Under this budget revision, WFP will extend the current interim country strategic plan (ICSP) for 22 months to end in December 2024 and make minor adjustments to its malnutrition prevention and treatment interventions.
2. The extension in time will allow WFP to align the next iteration of ICSP with one coherent international assistance plan and consolidated budget to address the humanitarian situation in the camps close to Tindouf. The envisioned work on a refugee response plan under the leadership of UNHCR is expected to commence in 2023. During the extension period, WFP will also work to enhance coordination and consultations with key stakeholders on the direction of the new ICSP.
3. In addition, the extension will allow WFP additional time to continue to build on the recommendations of the 2021 ICSP evaluation, including extensive evidence building and coordination with partners, likely taking well into 2023 before WFP will be able to use the resulting additional evidence to inform the next ICSP.
4. On nutrition programming, WFP carried out a review of transfer values in the first half of 2022, which resulted in a recommendation to revise the value of the vouchers for pregnant and lactating women and girls (PLWG) for malnutrition prevention. The resulting increase in the transfer value of cash-based transfers (CBT) reflects food price inflation since setting up the original transfer value in 2020, and is based on a more complete food basket reflecting consumption patterns of beneficiaries compared to the original food basket that included only three food items.
5. A 2022 nutrition survey found that WFP's coverage of treatment of acute malnutrition was insufficient compared to the needs: the prevalence of acute malnutrition increased from 4.7 percent in 2016 to 10.7 percent in $2022,{ }^{1}$ indicating a significant number of additional children age 6-59 months requiring treatment. Among PLWG, the prevalence of low mid-upper arm circumference also indicated a greater need, with the number of malnourished pregnant women increasing from 7.9 percent in 2019 to 21.4 percent in 2022. Thus, budget revision 3 will increase the caseload of beneficiaries under the nutrition activity (activity 4) to better respond to these identified needs.

## Changes

## Strategic orientation

6. This budget revision will not change the strategic orientation of the ICSP, which has now been aligned to WFP's new strategic plan and corporate results framework for 2022-2025. ${ }^{2}$
7. The previous budget revisions to this ICSP were as follows:
> Budget revision 1, approved by the Country Director in November 2021, introduced the capacity strengthening modality under strategic outcome 2 , revised the caseload of beneficiaries and rations for nutrition activities and made other minor operational adjustments.
> Budget revision 2, approved by the Regional Director in June 2022, extended the ICSP for eight months to end in February 2023 and made minor adjustments to the school feeding food basket.

## Strategic outcomes

## Targeting approach and beneficiary analysis

8. Over the course of the extension, WFP will continue to provide assistance to the same number of beneficiaries each year, with the exception of activity 4 (nutrition). To respond to worsening nutrition indicators and align with treatment coverage requirements, WFP will increase the number of beneficiaries planned to receive moderate acute malnutrition treatment from 600 to 2,900 children age 6-59 months, and from 900 to 1,000 PLWG per month under activity 4 . This will support WFP's integrated programmatic approach, which covers the basic caloric needs of food-insecure people through activity 1, complements nutrient intake of schoolchildren, PLWG and children age 6-59 months through activities 2 and 4 , and supports the local production of fresh foods through activity 3 . WFP's nutrition interventions also work in complementarity with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees' severe acute malnutrition treatment activities.

## Transfer modalities

9. For malnutrition prevention activities under activity 4, based on the cost of the reference food basket and recommendations from the recent review of transfer values, WFP will increase the value of the vouchers from DZD 1,400 (USD 10) to DZD 2,600 (USD 18.57), ${ }^{3}$ thereby adapting it to food price inflation and consumption patterns, thereby ensuring that beneficiaries can continue accessing an additional 250 kcal per day, complementing

[^0]transfers received under activity 1 . All other rations will remain the same over the course of the extension period.

## Monitoring and evaluation

10. In order to respond to recommendations from the 2021 external evaluation, Algeria country office will carry out a number of assessments, including a school feeding review, a nutrition causal analysis to inform a nutrition strategy, an integrated assessment covering gender and protection, as well as a nutrition survey and a decentralized evaluation for complementary activities. WFP will also work to build the capacity of cooperating partners on data reporting and monitoring and evaluation to improve the overall quality of evidence generated.
