Black Sea, and the Government-led  
**Grain from Ukraine**, for food exports



**>400,000 PEOPLE**  
served in the **newly accessible areas**  
with a swift and consistent support  
as soon as the areas became reachable



**~80% OF TOTAL EXPENDITURES**  
from 2022 (over USD 700 million)  
invested in the local economy: Locally  
sourced food contributed to  
humanitarian response in country and  
around the globe



**SOCIAL PROTECTION SYSTEMS**  
strengthened by partnering with the  
Government of Ukraine to improve the  
unified social benefits registry system
