




The combined effects of conflict, climate shocks, poor harvests and a macro-economic crisis including runaway inflation and currency volatility, significantly affected people's access to food in Sudan with **15 million being food insecure**. The United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) reached **9.3 million people** (56 percent female), with **168,506 metric tons** (MT) of food and **USD 83,562,002 million** in cash-based transfers.

and third-party implementing agency for Sudan Emergency Safety Net Project (SESNP). In the first round of distributions from August to October 2022, over 2 million beneficiaries were reached through cash-based transfers and in-kind distribution across 12 states. Additionally, approximately 1.27 million beneficiaries were biometrically registered.

Providing logistics support to the humanitarian community

Despite an increase in the number of disasters across the country, WFP remained critical in supporting the interagency response by providing critical logistics, air transport services, and information and communications technology (ICT) support. The United Nations Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS) carried 26,342 passengers from 100 partner organizations to 36 destinations and delivered 73.7 MT of light humanitarian cargo. WFP completed the construction and rehabilitation of Zalingei Airport in Central Darfur State. A 500-meter-long runway, passenger check-in and waiting areas were rehabilitated and toilets were installed.
