Thanks to the assistance provided by WFP and partners, famine-like conditions (IPC Phase 5), experienced in 2021 were averted, and emergency levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 4) did not increase further.

WFP is the country's largest school meals provider and the primary provider of technical assistance for the development and implementation of a national school feeding programme.

WFP strengthened its partnerships with the Malagasy Government, local communities, partners and other UN agencies, helping to advance policies and progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals.

OUR PARTNERS

WFP supports the Malagasy Government through collaboration with Ministries and government institutions, with support from contributions from donor governments.

WFP also works with UN Agencies; non-governmental organizations and the private sector.

Strategic outcome 1: Crisis-affected women, men, boys and girls in targeted areas are able to meet their basic food and nutrition needs before, during and after crises

- Decrease in beneficiaries with poor food consumption scores from 27 percent in February 2021 to 23 percent in August 2022.
- Increase in beneficiaries with borderline and acceptable food consumption score from 53.7 percent to 73.4 percent.
- WFP activated the shock responsive social protection approach, in collaboration with the Ministry of Population and Social Protection, providing ration top-ups in the form of cash-based transfers or commodities.

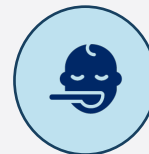

2022 Annual Country Report Highlights

Strategic outcome 2: Primary school children in targeted areas have access to adequate, healthy and nutritious food as part of a Government-led social protection strategy



325,000 schoolchildren benefitting from school meals programme



937 public schools supported

Strategic outcome 3: Nutritionally vulnerable populations in areas with consistently high rates of undernutrition have improved nutritional status



20,500 children aged 6-59 months supported through stunting prevention activities



21,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women and girls were supported through stunting prevention activities

Strategic outcome 4: Women and men smallholders producers in targeted communities facing climate shocks increase their capacity to access profitable markets and establish more inclusive, efficient and resilient food systems all year round



27,500 smallholder farmers supported with insurance, savings, and climate-adapted agriculture practices training



116,000 people benefitted from the rehabilitation and construction of productive assets like irrigation canals, drains, and dikes



9,700 smallholder farmers trained in **post-harvest loss reduction** to strengthen agricultural livelihoods



62,000 people benefitting from **anticipatory actions**

Strategic outcome 05: Government and humanitarian partners in Madagascar are supported by effective emergency preparedness and response arrangements before, during and after crises



Joint **community and feedback mechanism** established

22 early warning bulletins on the food security situation, nutrition, climatic conditions, and agro-silvopastoral campaign circulated



Drones deployed for assessments in cyclone-affected areas



3,500 passengers transported by the United Nations Humanitarian Air Service



A helicopter of 19 passengers and a cargo capacity of 3 mt deployed to landlocked cyclone-affected areas



87 mt of goods transported by the United Nations Humanitarian Air Service for **47 organizations**
