Highlights

- **2022** was the fifth consecutive year of drought for some areas in the southwest of Angola. **850,000 people needed food assistance** at the end of the year. To support populations in need, WFP had to significantly scale up its presence in the south.
- WFP continued assisting refugees from the Democratic Republic of Congo residing in the north of Angola. **90 percent of households in the Lovua refugee settlement** were still relying on food assistance as their main source of food. In addition to food assistance, WFP started an asset creation programme aimed at encouraging agricultural production in the settlement.
- WFP started working with **UNDP** to deliver **medical supplies** for TB, HIV, malaria, and COVID-19 to health units in Benguela, Cuanza Sul and Luanda provinces.
