WFP provided food assistance to 203,330 refugees (51% women and girls).



WFP distributed USD 3 million in cashbased transfers to over 256,000 vulnerable Tanzanians in urban areas.



**WFP** supported smallholder farmers and farmers' groups to access **USD 2.7 million** in agricultural loans.




**WFP** supported **79,500 farmers** (50% women) to improve access to quality inputs, predictable markets, and affordable finance.

**WFP** transported **160,000 mt** of food using rail, lake, and roads for operations in Tanzania and neighbouring countries
