KEY SUCCESS FACTORS



HIV remains a relevant issue for WFP in delivering its mandate of leaving no one behind



Nutrition-specific interventions play a significant role in meeting the urgent nutritional needs of affected populations



Effective performance of WFP is largely underpinned by its responsiveness, innovation and strong reputation



Programme effectiveness on HIV and Nutrition is increased through partnerships

CHALLENGES

Significant changes in the HIV landscape of late mean the Policy is no longer relevant



Commitment to nutrition integration is not yet matched by the institutional architecture to fully implement it



The absence of a strategy to manage declining funding puts the reputation of WFP at risk



Limited investment over the longer term compromises the ability to sustain partner collaboration



Limited evidence on the effective integration of gender equality and inclusion in programme design and implementation
