WFP PAKISTAN 2022 ANNUAL COUNTRY SUMMARY



SAVING LIVES CHANGING LIVES

In 2022 WFP provided relief, recovery and development assistance to **4.8 million people**, more than five times the planned number.

The surge was triggered by unprecedented monsoon rains that precipitated large-scale, devastating floods and aggravated already severe nationwide hunger and malnutrition.


The flooding affected **33 million people** – claiming over 1,700 lives and displacing 8 million – and caused USD 30 billion in damage and losses. The food, livestock and fisheries sectors were hit hardest. Two-thirds of those supported by WFP during the year – **3.1 million people** – suffered emergency levels of food insecurity and needed life-saving help.

WFP pursued a range of pressing priorities: urgent assistance to people affected by climate induced shocks; nutrition support to vulnerable children and women; enabling climate-prone communities to withstand extreme weather; and boosting government capacities to tackle hunger and emergency response.

The flooding warranted a strong focus on crisis response, however, WFP concurrently maintained its other core priority of treating malnourished children and mothers. Achievements included integrating key WFP activities into the national social protection system and accelerating the nationwide stunting prevention programme WFP spearheads, the Benazir Nashonuma Programme. Together with the Government of Pakistan, WFP continued implementing this programme, addressing the root causes of malnutrition in the country.
