


WFP Market Monitor - Sudan July 2023

- The national average retail price of sorghum was SDG387.1/1 Kg, a decrease of 5.68% compared to the previous month.
- The national average retail price of wheat flour was SDG1,319/1 Kg, an increase of 8.65% compared to the previous month.
- The national average retail price of the goat was SDG35,242/head, an increase of 1.01% compared to the previous month.
- The national average price of groundnut was SDG23,024/1 kantar, an increase of 4.27% compared to the previous month.
- The average cost of the WFP local food basket was SDG594.5/1 LFB, an increase of 4.04% compared to the previous month.

Food Security Outlook

The WFP local food basket cost, wheat prices, inflation rates, and casual-labour daily wages show an increase during July and June 2023. The foreign exchange rate showed a significant increase during July, while it slightly declined in May and June 2023 compared to the previous months (March/April). In July 2023, the average parallel exchange rate increased to 600SDG/1US\$ in July, while the commercial banks' average rate increased to around 580SDG/1US\$ (due to increasing demand for foreign currency to import inputs and goods). The inflation rates were not issued for the last 5 months of 2023, but with the skyrocketing prices of goods and services, it is estimated to exceed 200 percent by July. The WFP local food basket cost (LFB) increased to SDG594.5 in July compared to SDG571.4 in June, which is an increase of 4.04 percent. The LFB cost increased by 18.78 percent compared to the same month of the previous year (SDG500.5). The average daily wage rate of casual labor was slightly increased by 4.0 percent compared to June 2023, (increased from SDG5,403 to SDG5,618), while it was higher by 71 percent compared to the month of the previous year.

If these circumstances continue, it is expected that there will be a severe shortage in the supply of food and other essential commodities, which will complicate the situation, and thus the prices will increase progressively, and food security for the millions of Sudanese people will be at very high risk.




Sorghum Prices and Supplies in AlGadarif Auction Market

- In July 2023, the wholesale price of sorghum recorded in the Al-Gadarif Auction Market was SDG22,179/90Kg sack, which is a decrease of 8.0 percent compared to the previous month and below the same period of the previous year by 6.1 percent.
- The total supply of sorghum to the AlGadarif Auction Market during July 2023 increased to 787MT compared to 165MT in the previous month, while it was 80 percent above the quantity supplied during the same period of the previous year (436MT).





Sorghum Supplies in Al-Gadarif Auction Market (in MT)









Wheat Flour


National Average

In July 2023, the average retail price of wheat flour sharply increased to **1,319 SDG per 1 kg**, which is an increase of **8.65 percent** compared to the previous month. This is mainly

attributed to the interruption of wheat imports and the stoppage of several wheat mills in Khartoum and the high cost of transportation. The prices of wheat are expected to increase during the coming months due to a sharp increase in the exchange rate during the last month. As Sudan imports around **75.0 percent** of the required wheat, this will create a high risk to the food security of more than **30.0 percent** of the Sudanese population on wheat as the main source of cereal. The average retail price of wheat was **73.1 percent** higher than in the same month of the previous year.



By States



During July, the retail price of wheat flour increased in 7 out of 12 states compared to the previous month. It sharply increased in Blue Nile (73.7 percent), Red Sea (31.6 percent), White Nile (25.0 percent), Sinnar (23.0 percent), North Darfur (13.3 percent) and significantly increased in Nahr El-Neel (8.0 percent) and South Kordofan (7.6 percent). It sharply decreased in the Northern state (23.9 percent) and West Kordofan (18.4 percent), while it remained stable in the North Kordofan, Kassala, and Gizera states.

Compared to **July 2022**, the highest increase in the retail price of wheat flour was recorded in North Darfur, which increased by **139 percent**, followed by West Kordofan where it increased by **113 percent**, while the Red Sea showed the lowest increment **(33 percent)**.




Sorghum


National Average

In July 2023, the national average retail price of sorghum was **387.1 SDG/Kg**, which is a decrease of **5.7 percent** compared to **June 2023**. This decrease was due to the high

supply from the last summer crop as many farmers need to finance the current agricultural season as many banks are not financing the farmers due to interruptions in their banking systems. The average retail price of sorghum was higher by **7.3 percent** compared to the same period of the previous year. This is mainly attributed to the increase in the cost of production compared to the previous years. The average retail price of sorghum was higher by **236 percent** than the average for the past five years of July.



By States



The retail price of sorghum decreased in 6 out of 12 states compared to the previous month. It sharply decreased in Nahr Elneel (39.0 percent) while it decreased slightly in North Kordofan (7.7 percent), White Nile (5.4 percent), Red Sea (4.6 percent), Blue Nile (3.1 percent), and North Darfur (2.6 percent). It decreased in Sinnar (10.0 percent), West Kordofan (7.3 percent), the Northern state (6.7 percent), and South Kordofan (1.1 percent). It remained stable in Kassala and Gizera states.

Compared to the same period of the previous year, the highest increase in the retail price of sorghum was recorded in Kassala (21.0 percent), followed by North Darfur (17.7 percent) while White Nile showed a decrease in West Kordofan, White Nile, and North Kordofan (see the chart in Annex 1 on page 8). Sorghum prices were higher by 169 to 288 percent in eight states compared to the average of the past five years of July.




Goat


National Average

In July 2023, the average retail price of goat increased to **35,242 SDG per head**, which is a slight increase of **1.01 percent** compared to the previous month. This slight increase is

due to low demand from the local markets due to the diminishing purchasing power of the majority of the Sudanese population and the decline in the demand for imports due to the ongoing war. The average retail price of goats increased by **46.1 percent** compared to the same month of the previous year. This is mainly attributed to the high costs of production, such as supplementary feedings, medication, etc. The average retail price of the goat was higher by **235 percent** compared to the five years average of July.



By States



During July, the retail price for goats increased in **7** states and decreased in **4** states compared to the previous month. It sharply increased in White Nile (**41.0 percent**), Nahr ElNeel (**28.0 percent**), Northern (**20.0 percent**), and slightly increased Blue Nile (**7.0 percent**), North Kordofan (**5.0 percent**), West Kordofan (**1.0 percent**) and Red Sea (**1.0 percent**). It decreased in Kassala (**20.0 percent**), Gizera (**20.0 percent**), West Kordofan (**14.0 percent**), and North Darfur (**9.0 percent**). It has remained stable in Sinnar state.

The highest increase in the retail goat prices compared to the same month of the previous year was recorded in Kassala (60.0 percent); while it decreased in South Kordofan, North Darfur, and North Kordofan. Goat prices increased by 120 to 262 percent in different states compared to the five years average of July.






Groundnuts


National Average~

In July 2023, the average retail price of raw groundnut was **23,024 SDG per Kantar**, which is an increase of **4.27 percent** compared to the previous month. This increase is attributed to the

increasing demand from the local oil industry and the disruption of the oil and oilseeds imports due to the ongoing war. The average retail price of groundnut was higher by **55.7** percent compared to the same month of the previous year. This increase is mainly attributed to the high costs of production during the last two seasons. The national average price of groundnut was higher by **528** percent compared to the 5 years average of July.



By States



Groundnut retail prices increased in 6 out of 12 states compared to the previous month. It sharply increased in the Northern state (23.0 percent), Blue Nile (13.9 percent), Nahr Elneel (10.0 percent), and West Kordofan (10.0 percent), while it slightly increased in South Kordofan (5.1 percent) and White Nile (5.1 percent). It remained stable in the Red Sea and Sinnar states.

In **July 2023**, the largest increase in the groundnut price compared to the same period of the previous year was recorded in West Kordofan **(175 percent)** while Kassala state showed a decrease of **6 percent** (see the chart in Annex 1 on page 8). Groundnut prices have shown a sharp increase of **358 to 545 percent** in the states compared to the five years average of July.





Cost of WFP Local Food Basket (LFB)

Note: The cost of the food basket was calculated from the prices collected from the markets of 12 states due to the ongoing war

- In July 2023, the average cost of the WFP local food basket (LFB) was 594.5 Sudanese pounds/1 unit, an increase of 4.04 percent compared to the previous month. The cost of the basket showed an increase of 18.78 percent compared to the same month of the previous year.
- In July 2023, the highest cost of the WFP local food basket was recorded in West Kordofan (SDG686 per/unit) followed by North Darfur and Northern states, SDG676 and SDG655, respectively. The lowest WFP LFB cost was recorded in North Kordofan (SDG480).

WFP Local Food Basket Cost National Average











WFP Local Food Basket Cost - by State



Percentage Variation of the Local Food Basket Cost from National Average - By state















Casual Labor Wage - Daily Rate (SDG/Day)









Terms of Trade (TOT)


In July 2023, compared to the same period of the previous year (see charts below):

- There was an improvement in the terms of trade (TOT) between the WFP local food basket and casual labor wage in **six** states, while it decreased in **two** states.
- The TOT between the WEP LFB and one kantar of groundnut improved in **three** states while it deteriorated in **two** states and remained stable in **one** state.
- The TOT between WFP LFB and one middle-sized goat has improved in **two** states and deteriorated in **six** states.


Casual Labor Wage - Daily Rate versus WFP LFB units

Goat (one medium size) versus WFP LFB units




