Strategic Outcome 2: People have better nutrition, health and education outcomes

- **Act 1:** Provide food and non-food assistance to refugees living in camps.
- **Act 5:** Provide emergency food assistance through cash-based or in-kind transfers to shock-affected populations.

Some 2,000 people benefited indirectly from the programme through the participation of 501 trainees. 155 participants were enrolled in the vocational training courses in a variety of sectors (Artisan Chocolate, Chef Assistant, CNC Operator, CNC Wood, Leather Treatment Operator, Mushroom Farming, Pastry Chef Apprentice, Shoe Making and Welding), while 346 participants attended the Applied Training Programme (ATP), which

allows them to acquire practical experience by assigning a job in their trained sector for three months in exchange for minimum wage.

- As part of the 16 Days of Activism against gender-based violence, WFP Mersin Field Office conducted an awareness meeting in Hatay Cevdetiye camp with 19 of the most vulnerable women with infants. The team distributed 19 infant carriers produced by the women-only cohort of Sewing Machine Operator training in Ankara under the SES Programme.
- WFP Türkiye's CD participated in an event hosted by the Embassy of Ukraine to oversee the shipment of grain from WFP Global Commodity Management Facility (GCMF) stock. Under the Grain from Ukraine initiative, 25,000 mt of Ukrainian wheat were loaded on a Turkish vessel in the port of Samsun on 12 December 2023 to be shipped to Nigeria for WFP's operations.

Partnerships

- WFP Türkiye CD attended the TRT World Forum's panel on "The Critical Nexus of Food, Water, and Energy Security" as a speaker on 9 December and emphasized Turkey's critical role in terms of geographical and economic strengths, particularly as challenges in the region escalate.
- WFP Türkiye Country Office was represented by its Partnerships Unit in the panel on "Advancing Economic Inclusion Strategies" held on 14-15 December in Istanbul as part of UNHCR's Protection Dialogues II series. The panel brought together experts from international financial institutions, government bodies and international organizations, and served as a platform for in-depth discussion to identify effective approaches to refugees challenges in achieving economic participation.

Monitoring

- The Minimum Expenditure Basket (MEB) cost in refugee-populated areas increased by 3.7 percent since last month to reach TRY 2,183 (USD 75) per person per month in December 2023. The Earthquake MEB cost, calculated in the area affected by the February 2023 earthquakes, is TRY 2,345 (USD 80). The food basket cost per person per month reached TRY 900 (USD 31).
- WFP field teams' site coverage for the in-camp operation was 91 percent in December. The teams visited and filled out the on-site monitoring tool for all contracted markets in seven WFP-assisted refugee camps, except for Adana BIM Umut market. Additionally, beneficiary feedback surveys were conducted in all markets except for three in Yayladagi and one in Osmaniye. The beneficiaries showed high satisfaction with the e-voucher programme and did not report any pressing issues regarding access to markets or redeeming the assistance. Retailers, on the other hand, raised concerns about high inflation and high transportation costs.
