2022—2026 Multi-Country Strategic Plan

The United Nation’s World Food Programme (WFP) Caribbean 2022-2026 Multi-Country Strategic Plan (MCSP) lays out the framework for WFP’s priority actions in the Caribbean in line with its dual humanitarian and development mandate.

The MCSP articulates WFP’s support to regional institutions and national governments to address risks compounded by COVID-19 and the region’s economic, financial, geographic and climate-related vulnerabilities. These efforts aim to improve food and nutrition security, prepare for and respond to disasters and achieve climate resilience.

The MCSP aligns with the 2022-2026 United Nations Multi-Country Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UN MSDCF), covering 22 countries and territories across the English- and Dutch-speaking Caribbean.


Within the region, WFP supports governments nationally and regionally to tackle common challenges and ensure that Caribbean people, communities and institutions have enhanced adaptive capacity for inclusive, gender-responsive, climate and disaster risk management. By supporting preparedness measures that strengthen disaster risk management and social protection systems, WFP helps vulnerable people across the region to meet their food, nutrition and essential needs in times of crisis.

MCSP's Three Strategic Outcomes

WFP Caribbean's MCSP is organized around three integrated strategic outcomes that adopt an integrated systems strengthening approach, while facilitating WFP's rapid response capabilities in times of emergency.

1. National governments and regional institutions in the Caribbean have strengthened capacity to prepare for, adapt and respond to shocks and climate change.
2. Crisis-affected populations in the Caribbean are able to meet their food, nutrition and other essential needs during and in the aftermath of shocks.
3. Common services and platforms enable governments in the Caribbean to have a rapid, effective and coordinated response to shocks.



Outcome 1—WFP's Capacity Strengthening Pillar

WFP seeks to ensure regional and national institutions can meet the essential needs of vulnerable men, women, boys and girls in times of crisis and beyond. This will be achieved through strengthening institutional capacity to better deliver assistance and respond to shocks in areas of WFP's comparative advantage, including in the following areas:



Under SO1 WFP adopts an approach that focuses on strengthening disaster management, social protection and food systems. This includes the digitalization of processes, development of current and future disaster management and social protection professionals through training courses, workshops and simulation exercises, and by investing in critical assets and infrastructure that can be used to prepare for and respond to crises.

Outcomes 2 & 3—WFP's Emergency Response Pillars

In times of crisis, WFP is able to support national governments to provide **food, cash or voucher assistance** to those most impacted. WFP also stands ready to provide **logistics expertise, emergency telecommunications expertise** and help to **coordinate national response** to deliver life-saving food, non-food items and medical supplies in a crisis. WFP is working with governments to establish anticipatory action to assist vulnerable people **before** disasters strike.
