

WFP TAJIKISTAN

2023 Annual Country Report Overview

WFP focused on supporting livelihoods, improving agricultural production, enhancing health, education, and nutrition outcomes, as well as strengthening national institutions and systems. WFP is undertaking a strategic shift from direct implementation to enabling and strengthening the capacities of national and sub-national institutions to deliver on their food security and nutrition priorities.

Resilience Building

The multi-year funding from the Green Climate Fund has been the backbone in carrying out WFP's climate change adaptation interventions. Food assistance-for-asset activities were significantly increased with the addition of new funding.

provide capacity-strengthening training for male and female farmers to increase their knowledge and competence to diversify their livelihoods and increase their income sources. WFP supports strengthening national capacities for improving the climate-information system, weather forecasts and early-warning and agroadvisories to smallholder farmers.

School Feeding Programme



WFP's school feeding programme remains the largest operational component in Tajikistan, being implemented in 53 districts and towns of the country

WFP further reinforced efforts toward national ownership and institutionalization of the programme through constant technical support in developing the legislative and regulatory framework with functional mechanisms.




A national school feeding unit was established under the Ministry of Education and Science of Tajikistan

WFP continued to support the Committee of Emergency Situations and Civil Defense and enhanced the response capacity of the Rapid Emergency Assessment and Coordination Team (REACT).



205,464 people were covered under general food assistance in 42 districts and towns



13,409 people affected by floods received food assistance

Community feedback mechanisms were implemented in all food distribution points with plans to take them to scale in 2024.


