



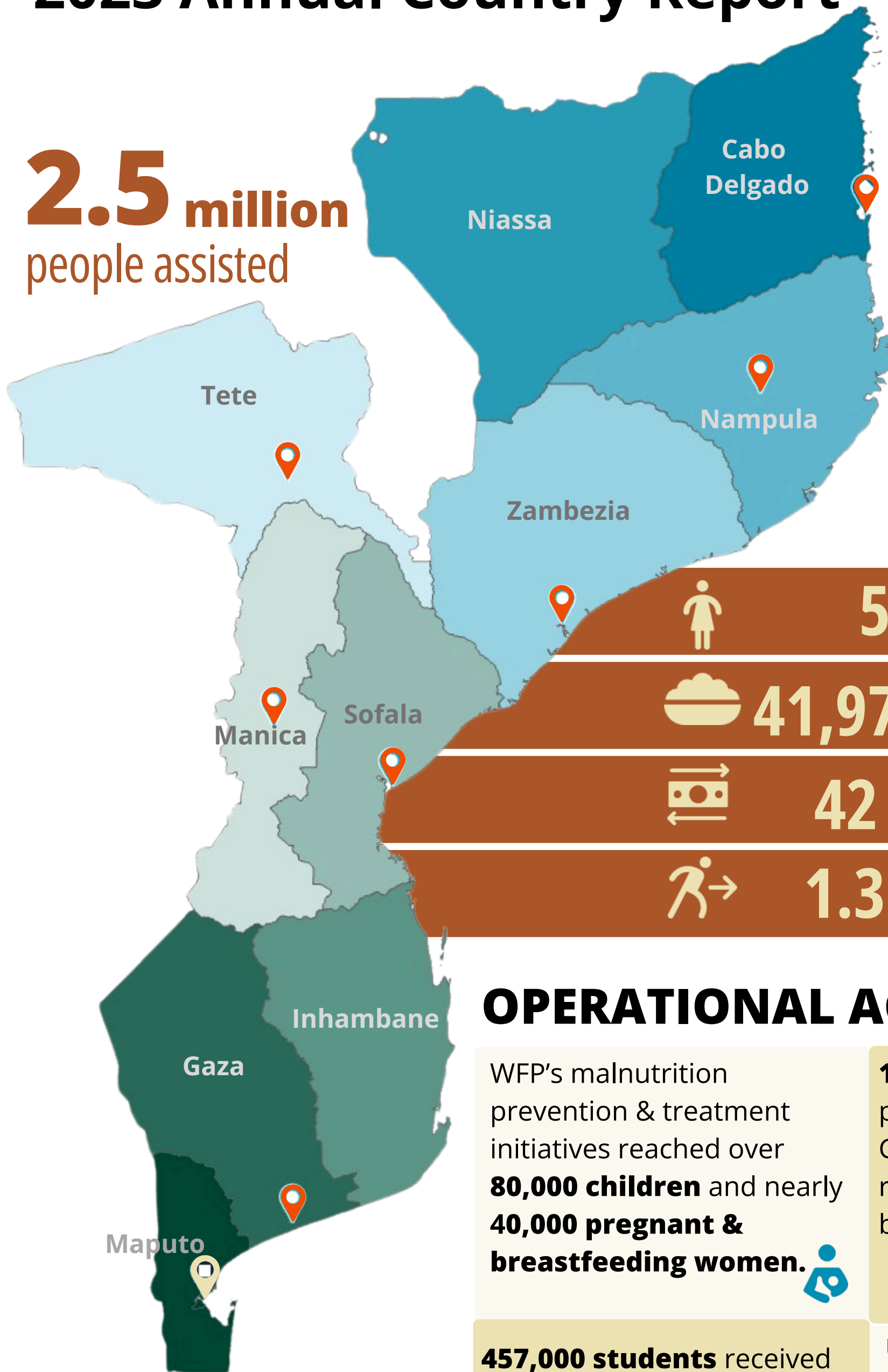

### OVERVIEW

In Mozambique, the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) assisted **2.5 million people in 2023** —of whom 52 percent were women— with life-saving food and nutrition assistance. An estimated 3.1 million people or around 1 in 10 Mozambicans experienced severe food insecurity during the peak of the lean season, with 17 percent of them living in the northern province of Cabo Delgado. The country continues to be most vulnerable to extreme weather events, having been hit twice by Cyclone Freddy. [READ MORE.](#)

### OPERATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

WFP's malnutrition prevention & treatment initiatives reached over **80,000 children** and nearly **40,000 pregnant & breastfeeding women.**

**143,000 individuals** participating in the Government's COVID-19 response received cash-based transfers.

**13,000 passengers** were transported via the United Nations Humanitarian Air Services (UNHAS).

**457,000 students** received nutritious school meals.

**US\$ 3.8 million** was generated for smallholder farmers with WFP's assistance.

**6,170 m3** of relief items were managed and stored by WFP.
