STRATEGIC POSITIONING AND ALIGNMENT



Aligned with national policies, strategies and existing consultation mechanisms



Important role within the UN country team in Conakry but less at the decentralized level



Emphasis on school feeding and resilience but limited emergency response preparedness

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS TO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE



School feeding interventions helped reduce drop-out among girls



Improved nutritional results for children, breastfeeding women and vulnerable populations thanks to holistic nutrition approach



Revitalized producer organizations and strengthened food value chains

Promoted inclusive and transformative approaches to sustainably overcome situations of nutritional vulnerability



Enhanced the preparation of integrated resilience projects, by improving targeting, adapting support to local context and providing a clear exit strategy
