WFP EGYPT HIGHLIGHTS:

- This year, WFP launched a self-reliance programme to support refugees and crisis-affected populations in Egypt to shift their reliance on immediate life-saving assistance to long-term livelihood and income opportunities through vocational trainings.
- WFP's women empowerment programme continued to provide vulnerable women in rural areas with entrepreneurship trainings, promoting their self-reliance.
- To promote youth employability and access to livelihoods, WFP launched the first series of youth vocational trainings in the area of green jobs.
