1. RATIONALE

- 1. To align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF 2023 2027), this budget revision (BR01) will extend the ICSP by 24 months until the end of December 2027 with a corresponding budget increase of USD 5.8 million. Responding to the changing context, BR01 will also make several operational adjustments to Iran's interim country strategic plan.
- 2. In August 2021, in anticipation of an influx of displaced people arriving from Afghanistan, the Government of Iran planned to establish two new refugee settlements in the provinces of Sistan and Balouchestan, and Khorasan Razavi. At the time, the Government had requested WFP support to meet the food and nutrition needs of 15,000 people in these new settlements as well as any additional influx into existing settlements. However, due to security concerns, the development of the new settlements was suspended, and accordingly WFP will no longer need to support this planned caseload under the general food assistance and school feeding activities. The budget allocated to support these planned caseloads will thus be reduced from the ICSP budget.
- 3. In the past years since the ICSP was developed, Iran has witnessed a significant fluctuation in the exchange rate of the Iranian Rial, with a devaluation resulting in cost savings for WFP's operation in Iran. Through BR01, WFP will adjust the USD-budgeted amount for cash transfer entitlements to align with actual operational needs.

2. CHANGES

Strategic orientation

4. BR01 incurs no changes to the strategic orientation of Iran's ICSP, however in addition to the extension in time, this BR will make operational adjustments under activities 01, 02, and 03.

ICSP outcomes

Targeting approach and beneficiary analysis:

- 5. Under Activity 01 (general food assistance), as the Government have suspended plans for new settlements to support displaced people arriving from Afghanistan, from January 2024 onward, WFP will reduce the number of targeted beneficiaries from 52,000 to 35,000. This reduction includes the planned population of the two cancelled settlements (15,000), and an additional 2,000 from the initially planned support to 6,000 newly arrived refugees that were intended to be sheltered in the current settlements, though the actual increase of refugees in the settlements has been more modest to date.
- 6. Under Activity 02 (school feeding), owing in large part to the suspended establishment of the two planned settlements, but also to the reduced numbers of new arrivals being sheltered in existing settlements, from January 2024 onward, the number of schoolchildren targeted to receive nutritious snacks on annual basis will be reduced from 14,800 to 10,186. Of those reduced, 3,000 will also be reduced from the students targeted to receive the girls education incentive. Correspondingly, the number of teachers targeted to receive assistance will be reduced from 1,200 to 814.
- 7. Under Activities 01 and 02, following a 2022 audit recommendation to automate the CBT process, in collaboration with WFP's Global Data Assurance Team, the Iran Country Office has developed and rolled out the 'Datahub' a specific tool which, since 2023, is being utilised to manage the deduplication of beneficiaries and process CBT transfers. This database will continue to be enhanced over 2024.
- 8. Under Activity 03 (emergency response), the number of beneficiaries targeted will increase by 10,000 to provide an additional contingency allocation of 5,000 beneficiaries for each additional year of the extended timeframe.

Transfer modalities:

- 9. Under Activity 01, WFP will reduce the USD value of cash transfer entitlements provided to beneficiaries to bring the transfer value in line with the revised USD value of the transfer, which is provided in Iranian Rial. The value of the transfer in Iranian Rial will remain unchanged.
- 10. Under Activity 02, in consultation with the Government, WFP will slightly increase the USD value of the cash transfer entitlements from USD 0.10 to USD 0.12 per day for girls receiving the education incentive to attend school. The increase in the value of the incentive will allow for it to continue to encourage families to send their girls to school.
- 11. In response to beneficiary feedback received through process monitoring, post-distribution monitoring, and through the community feedback hotline for activities 01 and 02, WFP will revise the in-kind basket as follows:
 - i) reduce the wheat flour ration from 15 kg to 12 kg per person per month and
 - ii) reinstate the distribution of 810gr of vegetable oil per person per month.

Service provision:

12. BR01 will facilitate the reduction of the planned budget allocated for on-demand services considering that no requests for on-demand services were received during 2022 or 2023. Therefore, the planned amount of USD 500,000 has been reduced to USD 50,000, as a placeholder for contingency should any need arise in future.

Risk Management:

13. The fluctuation of the exchange rate, alongside persistent inflation and economic downturn in Iran may pose a risk to the maintenance of adequate food consumption for beneficiaries. To mitigate this, WFP plans to conduct an assessment to determine the specific Minimum Expenditure Basket (MEB) for residents of the settlements. The objective is to ascertain the gap between the MEB and households' own resources, and to determine if the present cash transfer value requires adjustment to ensure that beneficiaries can meet their essential needs.
