KEY FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS





Programmatic decisions, informed by food security data, meant CSP continued to be relevant



WFP well positioned across the development-humanitarian nexus with growing enabler role and support to recurrent shocks



Clear and integrated programme logic and expanded partnerships served coherence



CSP RESULTS



WFP supported over 80 percent of vulnerable refugees and returnees



WFP spurred the scale up of school feeding to a national programme, following positive experiences



Attention to cross-cutting dimensions could be enhanced for better results



Good institutional sustainability supported by growing attention to country capacity strengthening



Resource gaps led to refugee rations cuts and limited progress on building self-reliance



WFP strengthened social protection, disaster management and food systems, with room for further progress



Despite enhanced attention to environment, further efforts are required

EFFICIENCY AND PERFORMANCE FACTORS





WFP delivery was timely, with high performing supply chains WFP targeting was evidence-based and generally effective but constrained by a lack of data



Shift to cash, cascade trainings and good use of partnerships improved efficiency



Lack of donor diversity and heavy earmarking strongly affected CSP funding and performance



Weaknesses in M&E failed to support programme improvement



HR capacities were not optimally aligned with CSP needs

RECOMMENDATIONS

Maintain a dual focus on saving lives and changing lives for the next CSP



Strengthen WFP approach to disability inclusion across the portfolio and focus more on gender Continue to pursue a multi-pronged CCS approach, informed by a corresponding strategy and enhanced monitoring

Upscale the focus on environmental and climate change throughout the next CSP Strengthen WFP's organizational readiness for delivery of the next CSP
