## MANAGEMENT RESPONSE TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE REPORT ON THE EVALUATION OF SCHOOL FEEDING MODALITIES APPLIED IN ARMENIA

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## **BACKGROUND**

This document presents WFP Armenia's management response to the Recommendations from the evaluation report on the Evaluation of School Feeding Modalities Applied in Armenia. The evaluation covered School Feeding Programme activities implemented between January 2018 to December 2023. It was commissioned to assess the programme's performance, fill evidence gaps, and inform the design of future school feeding interventions, as well as the new Country Strategic Plan. Taking a utilization-focused, consultative approach, the evaluation serves the dual purpose of accountability and learning.

The evaluation made a total of six recommendations, of which three are strategic and three operational. The response presented below sets out whether WFP Armenia agrees, partially agrees, or disagrees with the evaluation Recommendations and sub-Recommendations. It presents the planned (or taken) actions, responsibilities, and timelines.
