Management Response from WFP Country Offices in Colombia and Ecuador to the recommendations of the final evaluation of the binational adaptation project in Colombia and Ecuador from 2016 to 2024

1. This document, finalized in February 2025, presents the management response to the recommendations of the final evaluation of the Binational Adaptation Project in Colombia and Ecuador (2016-2024)

2. Commissioned by Colombia and Ecuador Country Offices, the evaluation covers all activities of the binational project funded by the Adaptation Fund, from its design in 2016, with a primary focus on the implementation period from May 2018 to April 2024. The evaluation serves the dual purpose of accountability and learning, and its primary users are the WFP, the Adaptation Fund, national and subnational government institutions in both countries, and the implementing entities.

3. The evaluation made 05 key recommendations with 7 actions. The matrix sets out whether WFP agrees, partially agrees or disagrees with the recommendations and sub-recommendations. It presents the planned (or taken) actions, responsibilities and timelines.
