OVERVIEW million In 2024, Mozambique faced significant challenges that people assisted exacerbated food insecurity and malnutrition, including the protracted conflict in the North, chronic poverty, multiple climatic shocks (El Nino drought, Cabo floods and cyclones) and social unrest. Working in Delgado collaboration with the Government, donor partners, Niassa UN agencies, and local stakeholders, in 2024 WFP assisted over 2.1 million people across all provinces of Mozambique. WFP implemented food security 9 programmes and interventions in 102 districts (out of 9 154), demonstrating its strong operational capacities and field presence. **READ MORE**.
