OVERVIEW

In 2024, Mozambique faced significant challenges that exacerbated food insecurity and malnutrition, including the protracted conflict in the North, chronic poverty, multiple climatic shocks (El Nino drought, floods and cyclones) and social unrest. Working in collaboration with the Government, donor partners, UN agencies, and local stakeholders, in 2024 WFP assisted over 2.1 million people across all provinces of Mozambique. WFP implemented food security programmes and interventions in 102 districts (out of 154), demonstrating its strong operational capacities and field presence. [READ MORE](#).

OPERATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

WFP's malnutrition prevention and treatment initiatives reached **78,000 children** and **25,500 pregnant and breastfeeding women and girls**.



270,000 people received early warnings for El Niño drought and **450,000 people** were alerted for Cyclone Chido.



13,404 passengers were transported via the United Nations Humanitarian Air Services (UNHAS).



242,000 children received food in **340 schools** through the national Home-Grown School Feeding Programme (PRONAE).



265 village savings and loans groups saved **US\$313,000**.



3,142 m3 of relief items transported by WFP in support of humanitarian organizations.
