I. RATIONALE

- 1. Revision 06 to Algeria's Interim Country Strategic Plan (ICSP) will extend the ICSP by 8 months, and will, at the request of partners, facilitate the provision of on-demand services to humanitarian actors over the extension period. Specifically, this revision will:
 - i. extend the ICSP by 8 months until February 2026;
 - ii. add activity 5 for On-Demand Service Provision; and
 - iii. increase the overall budget by USD 22.7 million.
- 2. In order to allow for additional time for consultations with the Government and partners on WFP's portfolio and activities, WFP has shifted the presentation of the new ICSP for Algeria to the February 2026 Executive Board session, necessitating an extension in time of eight months to enable operational continuity. This will further provide an opportunity to advance reassurance efforts incountry, a precursor to developing a new ICSP, working with communities and partners to maximize the impact of WFP assistance through enhanced targeting, monitoring and identity management.

II. CHANGES

Strategic orientation

3. In addition to the required extension in time, revision 06 will introduce a new activity under Outcome 1 through which WFP aims to support an enabling environment for the humanitarian community operating in the camps near Tindouf to implement their operations more effectively and efficiently. Through this new activity, WFP will offer a range of on-demand services to support requests from partners. These may include services related to supply chain, procurement and infrastructure, administration and operational management, technology solutions or data and analytics, and identity management. 4. The new Activity 5 statement will be included as follows: 'Provide on-demand services to humanitarian actors to efficiently support their assistance interventions.'

Targeting approach and beneficiary analysis:

5. The number and targeting of beneficiaries supported over the extension period will not change during the extended period.

Transfer modalities:

6. WFP will continue to utilise existing transfer modalities and rations under the ICSP activities during the extended period.
