KEY FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

STRATEGIC RELEVANCE



WFP responsive to national priorities in migration management



Transition to development-oriented interventions lacked strategic approach and integration in national systems



WFP was responsive to major shocks and evolving needs

EFFECTIVENESS AND SUSTAINABILITY



Effective large-scale emergency response benefitting refugees and earthquake-affected populations



Individual benefits of livelihood interventions but little sustainability at scale



Notable progress made on disability inclusion and gender equality

RESOURCING AND EFFICIENCY



Efficient use of resources and advance financing to sustain emergency programming



Absence of resourcing strategy, and high cost per beneficiary created efficiency challenges for livelihood programming

FACTORS AFFECTING WFP PROGRAMMING



Strong partnerships enabled delivery and handover of emergency social safety net and earthquake response



Low visibility and inconsistent coordination with national structures constrained effectiveness



Lack of strategic workforce planning led to skill mismatch and reduced programme effectiveness

RECOMMENDATIONS & LESSONS LEARNED

RECOMMENDATIONS

1

Strategically reposition WFP in Türkiye under a low-funding context, considering WFP's recognized global comparative advantages

2

Develop a strategic framework for support to community resilience in alignment with national priorities

3

Support the government's efforts to enhance emergency preparedness and response capacities, particularly at subnational level

LESSONS LEARNED

Integrating humanitarian aid into national social protection boosts scale, efficiency, and sustainability

Cash transfers work better when tailored to specific needs (e.g. women, persons with disabilities)

For broader results in a middle-income context, a stronger integration in government-led processes is essential

Flexible overhead rates may make WFP more competitive to secure funding in development-focused settings
