MANAGEMENT RESPONSE TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE REPORT ON THE EVALUATION OF THE EU MADAD PROJECT: "STRENGTHENING SAFETY NETS IN LEBANON TO SUPPORT THE MOST VULNERABLE LEBANESE AND SYRIAN REFUGEES"

BACKGROUND

This document presents the findings of the Decentralized Evaluation (DE) of the World Food Programme's (WFP) European Union (EU) MADAD Project: "Strengthening safety nets in Lebanon to support the most vulnerable Lebanese and Syrian Refugees" funded through MADAD TF-MADAD/2019/T04.153 and implemented from February 2019 to February 2025. The evaluation was conducted as part of the contractual obligations between WFP and the EU. It aims to address the dual and mutually reinforcing objectives of accountability and learning which were equally prioritised in the analysis with gender treated as a cross-cutting objective.

The evaluation made a total of 5 recommendations. The response presented below sets out whether WFP Lebanon CO agrees, partially agrees, or disagrees with the evaluation Recommendations and sub-Recommendations. It presents the planned (or taken) actions, responsibilities, and timelines.
