



**COUNTRY CONTEXT****COUNTRY STRATEGIC PLAN (CSP)** focused on five strategic outcomes**KEY FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS****STRATEGIC RELEVANCE AND COHERENCE**

The ICSP and the CSP positioned WFP to address both food security and nutrition needs



The ICSP and CSP remained largely relevant over time despite navigating a complex political situation, ongoing conflict, chronic disasters, and negative effects of climate change

**TARGETING AND PRIORITIZATION**

Targeting prioritized the most vulnerable using needs assessments and vulnerability criteria, but outdated data and population mobility challenged accuracy

RESULTS AND PERFORMANCE

WFP's most significant contribution was in scaling up its assistance, with food and cash, to prevent famine during the 2021-2023 drought



WFP supported key nutrition, livelihoods, school feeding, although performance was affected by funding constraints and delivery challenges



WFP supported the rollout of Somalia's national social protection system which was handed over to the Federal Government in 2024



WFP strengthened capacities of Somalia's national institutions and government agencies, adopting a more strategic, sector-specific approach than taken previously



WFP's resilience programming enhanced market access for farmers but performance was constrained given limitations in funding and logistics

**CROSS-CUTTING ISSUES**


WFP upheld humanitarian principles, addressed protection risks, and promoted gender inclusion despite cultural and political challenges

PARTNERSHIPS

Strategic and operational partnerships, particularly with federal and state governments, and cooperating partners, were critical for achievement of the CSP results



Opportunities for joint programming with other UN agencies and private sector were not fully exploited



WFP took steps to improve cost-efficiency and timeliness of programmes and delivery systems, with positive results



Amidst security, access, and infrastructure challenges, WFP took a systematic approach to risk management, helping sustain donor trust

**EFFICIENCY AND RISK****RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Strengthen linkages in the implementation of relief to resilience and capacity strengthening
2. Ensure needs-based plan is informed by realistic resourcing assumptions, scenario planning, and resource mobilization strategy
3. Improve programme design and adaptation based on better integrated analysis and monitoring data
4. Align partnerships with the requirements of the next CSP to ensure clarity on partnerships
5. Ensure the government capacity-strengthening approach is based on clearly articulated objectives and defined targets
