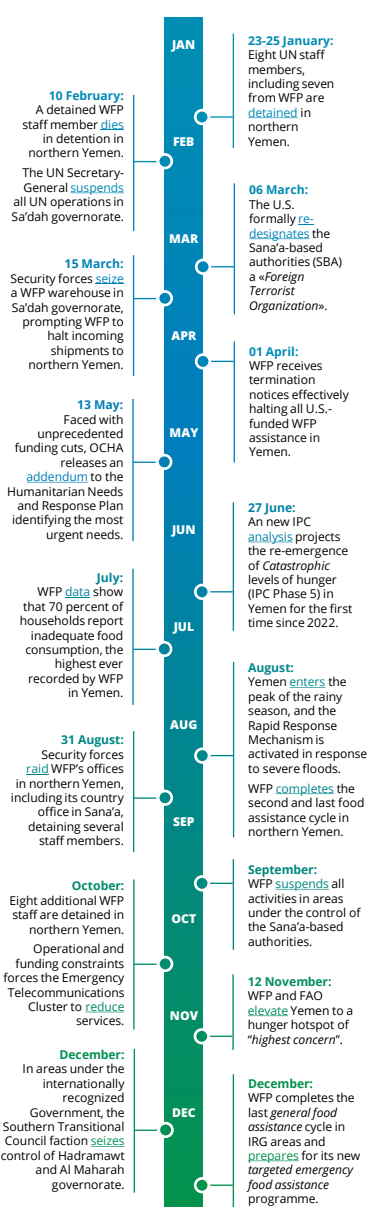

**Severe funding cuts drove a sharp contraction and reprioritization of WFP assistance.** Contributions fell by over 70 percent, prompting a shift to stricter, needs-based targeting to maximize the impact of limited resources.

**WFP sustained life-saving impact despite operational constraints.** WFP directly assisted 8.6 million people while supporting the response of 126 partners across sectors as a key enabler of the wider humanitarian response.

**The United Nations faced a collapse of the operational space in areas under the Sana'a-based authorities.** The **detention** of staff and seizure of offices forced the complete suspension of United Nations activities in northern Yemen.

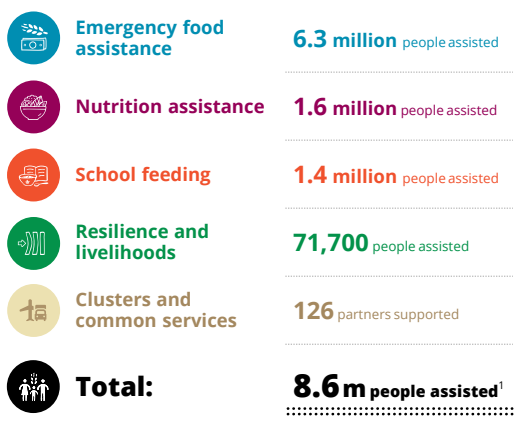


## WFP OPERATIONS

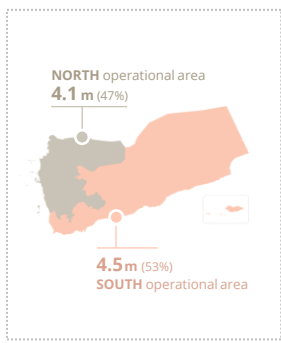
### WFP ASSISTANCE | 2025

By operational area<sup>2</sup>



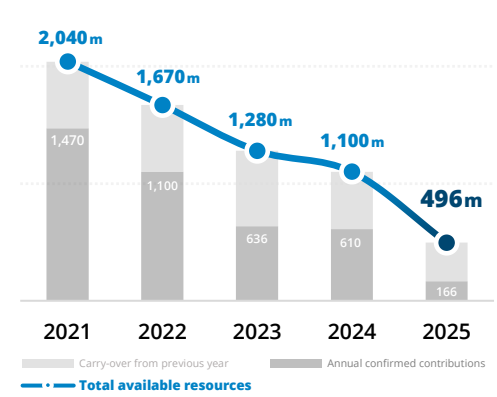

In millions of US\$



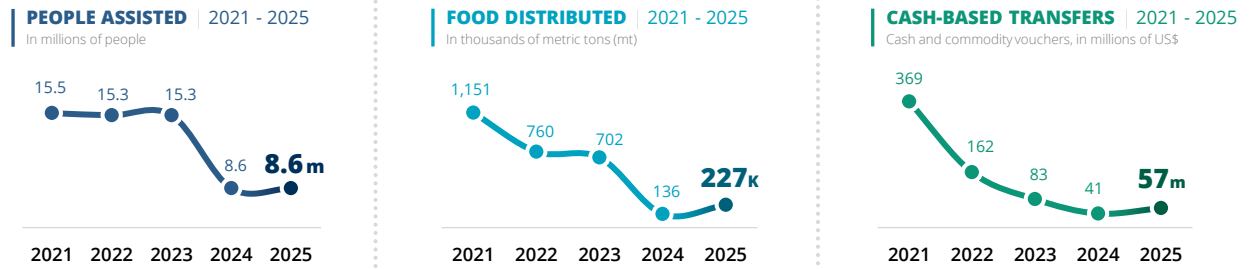
### TOP DONORS | 2025

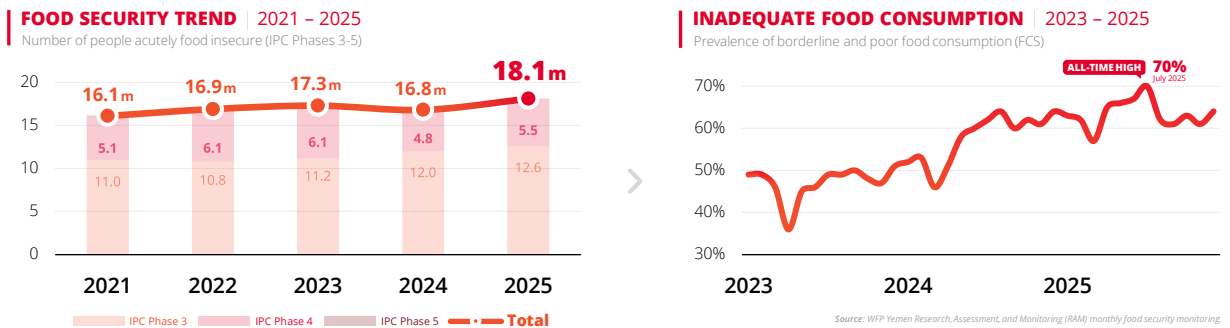
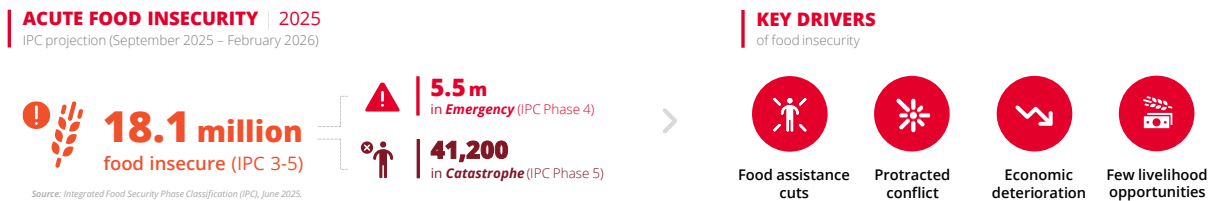
## WFP ASSISTANCE TRENDS

WFP has seen gradual decrease in funding in recent years as well as a shrinking space for principled humanitarian action. This has led to a significant contraction of all forms of WFP assistance.



## FOOD SECURITY SITUATION

The 2025 Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) analysis projected that 18.1 million people, 52 percent of the population, would be acutely food insecure in Yemen by September 2025. [\[READ MORE\]](#)
