

#### 2018 - Global Incident Statistics



- 1,026 security incidents affected WFP and Partners/Contractors
- One member of personnel killed due to violent conflict
- Six drivers of WFP-contracted trucks were killed while providing services for WFP
- Top 5 Countries with highest incident numbers: Yemen, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Sudan, Democratic Republic of the Congo




#### 2018 - Global Incident Statistics



- Comparison to 2017
  - 12% increase in overall incident numbers
  - 62% increase in incidents caused by Armed Conflict

- Main trends unchanged
  - crime remains the main security threat to WFP
  - contractors/partners are exposed to heightened security risks




# DR Congo – Staff member killed




#### **Security & Partnerships**
