

- Prioritized activities which save lives
- Prioritized the worst affected geographical areas
- Prioritized the most vulnerable households
- Reduced the size or frequency of rations and other assistance

Programme Highlights

91.4 million people received assistance 61% children and 52% women and girls **10%** refugees and **18%** IDPs 18.3 million schoolchildren received meals in 65 countries 19.2 million people received USD 1.4 billion cash/vouchers **1.25** million cubic meters of dams constructed 60,000 government officials trained 869 NGOS partnered with WFP **328,000** passengers flew with UNHAS
