Factors


- Multiple security threats and of security actors

Security 2018


- Deterioration beyond Spring 2018

IED INCIDENT: WFP CONTRACTOR AND COMMODITIES




GROUND FORCES: G5 AND ARMED ACTORS




Political Uncertainty Protests and Civil Unrest Further Deterioration in Greater Kasai Likely Military Resurgence **FOOD INSECURITY**
