Situation Update

- As of 1 January 2018, WFP activities in South Sudan are now being implemented under a dual structure with the Interim Country Strategic Plan (ICSP), PRRO and EMOP. This will allow WFP to align its relief, recovery and development interventions to the globally embraced 2030 Agenda. Also allowing WFP to better identify its contributions in the country and establish a direct link between resources and results, improving the delivery and impact of its assistance.
- The new structure is based on the four Strategic Outcomes that WFP aims to achieve in South Sudan, which are also linked to Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 2 and 17. WFP will focus on enhancing accountability to affected populations through increased community engagement and advancing gender equality following a gender-transformative approach in all activities.

WFP Response



Food and Nutrition Assistance

- WFP resumed the integrated rapid response mechanism (IRRM) and currently has seven teams deployed in Bilkey, Nyandit, Kurwai, Jaibor, Chuil, Buot and Ulang, providing life-saving food and nutrition assistance to around 96,633 people, including 17,370 children under the age of five. WFP plans to deploy an additional 26 missions in the coming six weeks, targeting close to 400,000.
- As part of the IRRM WFP plans to conduct airdrops in hard to reach locations and has deployed drop zone coordinators to Kurwai in Canal and Jaibor in Fangak and to Buot in Ayod.



- WFP continues to deliver food and nutrition commodities by all means possible – by road, air and river – across South Sudan. In 2017, WFP dispatched a total 271,667mt of food commodities including 81,347mt assorted commodities delivered by air.
- To better respond to the needs in 2018, the transhipment yard has been re-opened in Juba for cross loading of assorted commodities destined for different locations in the country.
- On 3 January, a WFP convoy with 11 trucks carrying 375mt assorted commodities from Juba arrived in Rumbek. On 4 January another 20 truck -convoy carrying 765mt departed from WFP Juba warehouses and arrived at POC1 and POC3 in Juba.

Reporting

 WFP South Sudan situation report which until now has been published on a weekly basis will evolve into a fortnightly publication with immediate effect. However, if required WFP will revert to weekly publication.

Clusters and Common Services



Food Security & Livelihoods Cluster

- Food Security and Livelihoods cluster has started the process of compiling a list of casual labour activities and wage rates paid by different humanitarian partners in the country. The list will be analyzed by the Inter Cluster Working Group with the aim to reach an agreement between the humanitarian partners on standardized wage rates.
- The Cash Working Group has developed a Standard Operating Procedure for voucher programme implementation for all humanitarian partners in South Sudan using Cash Based Transfer as a transfer modality.



Logistics Cluster

- In the past week, the Logistics Cluster facilitated the delivery of approximately 153mt of cargo to Akobo, Ganyiel, Jangok, Jiech, Leer, Luil, Mandeng, Mankien, Mogok, Nyal, Padek, Pieri, Ulang and Wai on behalf of nine organizations.
- The Logistics Cluster continues to support the humanitarian community with inter-agency convoys along key supply routes in South Sudan. The schedule for Logistics Cluster convoys is available here.

UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- Over the past week, UNHAS transported 717 passengers and 10.7mt of light cargo to 51 destinations in South Sudan.
- WFP aviation performed 21 flights, air dropping 613mt of food commodities over the same period.
